"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."


Isaiah 43:19



Hello St. Mark Family!

As we step into 2025, we find ourselves standing at the threshold of new opportunities—opportunities to welcome people to Jesus, bring others to worship, and share the love of Jesus with those around us.


