



Jason's Journal



The season of Lent is my favorite liturgical season in the life of the church. As I consider my previous statement, I am reminded of the full schedule the season of Lent presents to pastors and the church, especially during Holy Week. Yet, Lent still holds a special place in my heart and life. I believe the season of Lent is my favorite because the season itself

calls for the church to fully reflect and evaluate one's life. We are called to reflect and evaluate our lives in light of the life of Jesus. We are called to use the life and teachings of Jesus as a mirror to our own lives so that we may better reflect the life and teachings of Jesus in all that we say and do. I do not know about you, but for me the intentional time of reflection and evaluation of my own life leads to a sense of conviction and my need for repentance, so that my life is better following in the ways of Jesus. Finally, I believe the season of Lent is my favorite in that from sunset on Maundy Thursday through sunset on Easter day are the climax of Lent and the Christian life. Without the death and resurrection of Jesus, we have nothing to believe in nor do we have any hope.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent is a season of preparation for celebrating the hope of Easter. We prepare for Easter by not only reflecting upon the teachings and life of Jesus, but also remembering the great sacrifice Jesus gave in the giving of His own life for the forgiveness of sins of all people. For many, the season of Lent is spent preparing not only in self-reflection and self-evaluation, but also with intentional times of prayer, fasting, serving, and giving.

As I consider all of these ways in which one can prepare during the season of Lent, I am reminded of the above passage from Proverbs 3:5-7. The Proverbs are often described as wisdom literature in the Scriptures. The Proverbs give great insight of how someone should live their life in a way that honors and obeys God in all that they do; our lives are guided by wisdom from God rather than wisdom from humanity.

This season of Lent, the above passage from Proverbs will be a guide for me in my daily devotions and prayer time. I wonder if you would join me during the forty days of Lent to allow Proverbs 3:5-7 to serve as a guide for self-reflection, self-evaluation, and a reshaping of our lives so that we may be more like our Lord and Savior, Jesus.


