Jason's Journal

1 Corinthians 12:4-7


In 2005, Amber and I celebrated our first Christmas together. As a young couple we were both full of excitement for our 1st Christmas together. I remember as we both exchanged gifts we had purchased for each other. I remember Amber looking at me with a glimmer in her eyes as she waited on me to open the gift she had given me. As

as she waited on me to open the gift she had given me. As soon as I began to tear open the wrapping paper, I knew exactly what it was. She had purchased me a new electric guitar. I remember holding that guitar in my hands, plugging it into my guitar amp, and playing one of the smoothest guitars I have ever played. I still have that guitar and to this day has been one of the most thoughtful gifts I have ever received. However, I have had for quite some time an issue with the gift. The guitar that was gifted to me by my wife quietly sits in its case and is hardly ever used. The issue I have with the gift is not the gift itself, but rather me not using the gift that was given specifically to me. Why in the month of May would I reminisce about a Christmas nearly 20 years ago? As the church, if we are not careful and intentional, we can treat our spiritual gifts the same way I have treated my guitar. We can figuratively box up our spiritual gifts and not use the gift God has specifically given us through the power of the Holy Spirit.

In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, he addressed the Corinthian church regarding many matters, one of which was their use of spiritual gifts. As followers of Jesus, as the church, we have all been given at least one spiritual gift to be used for the equipping and building of the church. The gift or gifts we have been specifically given are not meant to be used for ourselves, but for the sake of others. In order to help the Corinthian church understand this, Paul used the giving of spiritual gifts to the church to that of the human body. Paul reminded the church that we are one body with many members. As members of the body, just like individual body parts, we all have different roles so that the body functions as it should. In the verses above from 1 Corinthians 12, Paul reminded the church that there are a variety of gifts, services, and activities; yet, it is the same God and same Spirit that activates and manifests them all in the life of believers. While there are numerous gifts the Spirit gives, they are all given for the common good - the common good of the whole church. The question for each of us then, are we using the specific gifts given to us, or have we locked them away in a case?

As I have reflected upon these things, I am reminded of a few things. First, I am reminded of the membership vows of the United Methodist Church which state, "I will serve this church with my prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness." Secondly, I am reminded of questions John Wesley encouraged small groups of early Methodists to ask, discuss, and help hold one another accountable in their Christian life. The questions are as follows: Where are you restless? What is God calling you to do? What will you plan to do for God's Kingdom this month? Finally, I am reminded of the gift of that beautiful guitar sitting locked away in its case; which leads me to pray, "Lord, by your grace may the spiritual gifts you have given me not stayed locked away, but be used for the common good of Your church!"

Hello St. Mark Family,

Not long ago, astronauts Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams found themselves stranded on the International Space Station. A malfunction in their spacecraft left them stuck in orbit for nearly nine months, far longer than planned. Isolated and far from Earth, Butch found himself doing what many of us might not expect: attending church every Sunday, virtually, of course. It wasn't out of convenience; it was out of necessity. Virtual worship was his only option, and he clung to it because he was hungry. Hungry for God. Hungry for worship. Hungry for connection.

Meanwhile, here on Earth, we have more freedom than many believers around the world. In countries like China, where Christianity is restricted or even illegal, followers of

Jesus walk for miles, often in secret, just to attend an underground church gathering. They risk imprisonment, persecution, and even violence because they long to worship.

Why? Because they're hungry. Hungry to hear the gospel. Hungry to be with other believers. Hungry to feel the presence of God.

So, the question comes home: *Are we hungry?*

Too often, we treat worship as optional. If there's nothing else going on, if we're not too tired or out of town, then maybe we'll go. Or maybe we'll just watch online from the couch. But online worship is meant to be a blessing when we truly can't be here, not a fallback when we simply don't feel like it. Each week at St. Mark, we begin worship with these words:

"A life connected to God and a life connected to one another is the most meaningful life we can have. And so, we gather together in this space at this time each week to connect with God and connect with each other so that we can live the life we are called to live."

We say these words, because worship matters. It's not just a routine or a box to check, it's how we stay rooted. It's how we are reminded who we are, whose we are, and what our purpose is.

Let's remember the astronaut who craved worship from space. Let's remember the underground churches packed with faithful people risking it all. And let's remember that our sanctuaries, right here at St. Mark UMC, every Sunday, are sacred spaces where we connect with the living God and with one another.

So, *Are we hungry?* Let's find that hunger again. And let's gather to be filled. I look forward to seeing YOU at CHURCH soon! BRING A FRIEND!
