


### Jason's Journal

Dear St. Mark Congregation, I hope this message finds you well. I'm writing to you today in my role as Chair of the Financial Committee to share an important update regarding our church's finances.

As many of you know, St. Mark established a fund back in 2005 called the Masters Plan. For those who have joined us in the years since, the Masters Plan was created to support the vision of building a new sanctuary, originally intended for the Bypass Compass location, during a time when the contemporary service was rapidly growing in the small hut behind

the Bypass.

Since then, our church has evolved, and we are now blessed to worship in our current building on Rivers Street. With that in mind, and after careful consideration, the Financial Committee has voted to officially discontinue the Masters Plan in its original form.

Going forward, any reference to the "Masters Plan" in our church budget will be repurposed to support capital improvement projects at either of our campuses—Bypass or Rivers Street—as needs arise.

We understand that many of you have contributed, and may still be contributing, specifically toward the original Masters Plan. We want to be transparent about this change so that you can make informed decisions about how to designate your future contributions. As always, we are deeply grateful for your generosity and support in whatever form you feel led to give.

If you have any questions about this decision, please don't hesitate to reach out to me directly. I'd be happy to provide further clarification.

Thank you for your continued trust in the leadership of St. Mark. We remain committed to stewarding our resources wisely and leading our church in the direction God has called us.
