

Jason's Journal

"Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Hebrews 10:24-25

Friday, August 15th, Amber and I moved Brady to Clemson as he prepared to begin his freshman year of college. The trucks were loaded, Brady and I were talking, and I was

offering him some fatherly advice before we left home. I looked at Brady and said, "Son, here are a few things I want you to remember when you get to Clemson. Every day, ask God to give you wisdom in everything you do. Get involved with a church and a small group. Be careful what parties you go to and who you hang out with. Finally, stay away from crazy women. Those last two things, parties and crazy women can lead you down a wrong path quickly."

As I have thought about my farewell address to Brady on that day, I have spent time reflecting on the first two 'nuggets' of advice I gave to him. Ask God to give you wisdom in everything you do, and get involved with a church and small group. I think those two are good advice for anyone, no matter your age. The Scriptures remind us that we are to ask God for wisdom and God will graciously give it. I am also reminded of the wisdom I have gained in continuing to show up in worship and in connecting with other believers in Sunday school, Bible study, and small groups. I think that is why it is important for followers of Jesus to not neglect meeting together, because we all need the encouragement of our church family in this world in which we live. In addition, while I believe it is of upmost importance to gather together for worship, I believe one of the ways we grow deeper in our faith is through opportunities like Sunday school, Bible Study, and small groups. Andy Stanley once said, "You grow deeper in your faith sitting in circles, not rows." What he meant by those words was that while sitting in rows during worship is important, true spiritual growth comes when you are able to sit with other believers, talk, listen, and learn together from the Scriptures.

I wonder, if you are not involved in a class or small group, what is stopping you? I would encourage you to consider one of our existing classes or possibly even start your own. Let me know if I can help you find your place in a class or study at St. Mark UMC.






Hello St. Mark Family!

Do you ever get a question in your head and wrestle with it? Like one of those life-changing, mindset-changing type questions? That happened to me last year, and it led me through an interesting journey. The question what simple, and yet the answer was far from it. The question was, if you woke up tomorrow morning and heard God audibly say "Yes," how would you respond? I don't mean a vague yes, but a direct, clear voice saying, "I'm saying yes to everything you prayed for last week."

Would the world around you look different? Would your neighbors, your workplace, your family feel the impact of those prayers? Would there be stories of transformation, or would things look mostly the same because our prayers

were, if we're honest, a little timid? Sometimes we pray like we're testing the waters, asking for things so small that, if they happened, no one would even notice. We pray for comfort instead of change. We pray safe prayers, because bold prayers feel risky. After all, what if God doesn't answer the way we hoped?

But Scripture shows us a God who responds to bold, faith-filled prayers. Elijah prayed for the rain to stop, and it did. Bartimaeus cried out for sight, and he saw. The early church prayed for Peter's release from prison, and the doors swung open. These weren't casual, "if You get a chance" prayers. They were specific, confident requests to a God who holds all power.

The truth is that timid prayers teach our hearts to expect little. But bold prayers, prayers that risk something, remind us that God still moves mountains. They shift our perspective from what's possible in our strength to what's possible in His. And here's the thing, bold prayer is not about arrogance or presumption. It's not about getting God to sign off on our wish list. Bold prayer is about trusting His heart enough to bring Him our deepest hopes and biggest fears and then resting in the truth that however He answers, it will be good. When we pray boldly, we're saying, "God, I believe You can, I trust that You will, and I'll follow You even if the answer looks different than I imagined."

So here's the challenge - what if we prayed this week as if God's answer would be yes? What if we believed that His love is bigger than our fear, that His plans are better than our own, and that His power is not limited by our circumstances? I believe we'd see more than just answered prayers. We'd see lives changed, faith strengthened, and God glorified. And maybe, just maybe, we'd start to realize that the greatest gift in prayer isn't just God's "yes" but the deeper relationship we build with Him when we dare to ask.

So, if you heard God say yes... what would you dare to pray for?

I hope you have an amazing September, and I look forward to seeing YOU at CHURCH! BRING A FRIEND!!

Kids' Talk


Kids' World is off to a great start for our 2025/2026 school year! We have been praying for weeks that God would send us some qualified teachers to add to our staff, and we are
