### Jason's Journal

*“The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.”*

John 1:5

This is a picture I took in 2023 while in South Dakota pheasant hunting with my family. I was able to capture this beautiful sunrise one morning before breakfast. As soon as I saw this beautiful display of God's handiwork I thought of this one verse from John's Gospel, *The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it*. I remember that morning being in awe and reminded of this truth found in John's Gospel. While there were still dark clouds on the horizon, there was light still shining across the plains, dawning a new day with new beginnings and new opportunities.

St. Mark UMC, as we begin the new year together God's light is still shining upon us and through us. God is offering to God's church new beginnings and new opportunities this year to go and proclaim the Good News of Jesus to all the world. In the month of January, we will enter a sermon series entitled, *New Beginnings*. Robby and I both believe God has tremendous things in store for St. Mark as we continue to reach out in ministry and mission into the dark world around us. While we may watch the news or look out into our communities, homes, and places of work it can seem at times that the darkness of evil is overpowering the light of Christ. Hello St. Mark Family!

It's hard to believe it's already 2026. It feels like just yesterday we were saying the same thing about 2025. Time has a way of moving faster than we expect, and the turn of a new year often brings a mix of emotions. There is excitement for what lies ahead, reflection on what has been, and sometimes a quiet awareness of how quickly seasons pass. A new year invites us to pause, to take stock, and to ask again who God is calling us to be.

As United Methodists, our mission is clear and deeply rooted in Scripture, *to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world*. Those words are familiar to many of us, but the beginning of a new year is a good time to ask what they actually mean for our lives right now, not in theory, but in practice.

Jesus' final words to His disciples still echo across generations, *"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."* (Matthew 28:19-20)

Making disciples is not a program we run or a box we check. It is a way of life. It begins with our own relationship with Jesus; how we listen to Him, follow Him, and allow Him to shape our hearts. Discipleship is formed in worship, in prayer, in Scripture, and in community. It grows when we choose faithfulness in ordinary moments, when we forgive instead of holding grudges, when we show grace instead of judgment, and when we live with hope in a world that often feels overwhelming.

Transformation does not always happen in loud or dramatic ways. Paul reminds us, *"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds"* (Romans 12:2). Transformation begins within us before it ever flows through us. As God renews our hearts and minds, our lives begin to reflect Christ in ways that touch others. In 2026, making disciples will look much like it always has, loving God and loving our neighbors. It looks like showing up for worship, even when life is busy. It looks like serving when it would be easier to sit back. It looks like teaching our children what it means to follow Jesus, not just with our words but with our actions. It looks like caring for one another, especially in times of grief, uncertainty, and change.

Jesus tells His followers, *"You are the light of the world... let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven"* (Matthew 5:14-16). The world does not need more noise; it needs faithful, loving witnesses who reflect the light of Christ. When we live out our faith in tangible ways, we participate in God's work of transformation. As we step into this new year together, my prayer is that we would recommit ourselves to the call Christ has placed before us. That we would remain rooted in worship, grounded in Scripture, and open to the movement of the Holy Spirit. That we would see every interaction, every relationship, and every opportunity as a chance to point others toward Jesus.

The year ahead will bring joys and challenges we cannot yet see. But we do not walk into 2026 alone. God goes before us, walks beside us, and calls us forward with purpose and hope. May we be faithful disciples, living out our calling so that lives, communities, and the world around us might be transformed by the love of Jesus Christ.

I pray 2026 brings you joy, renewal, and a stronger, deeper faith. I look forward to seeing YOU at CHURCH! BRING A FRIEND!

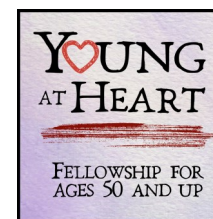

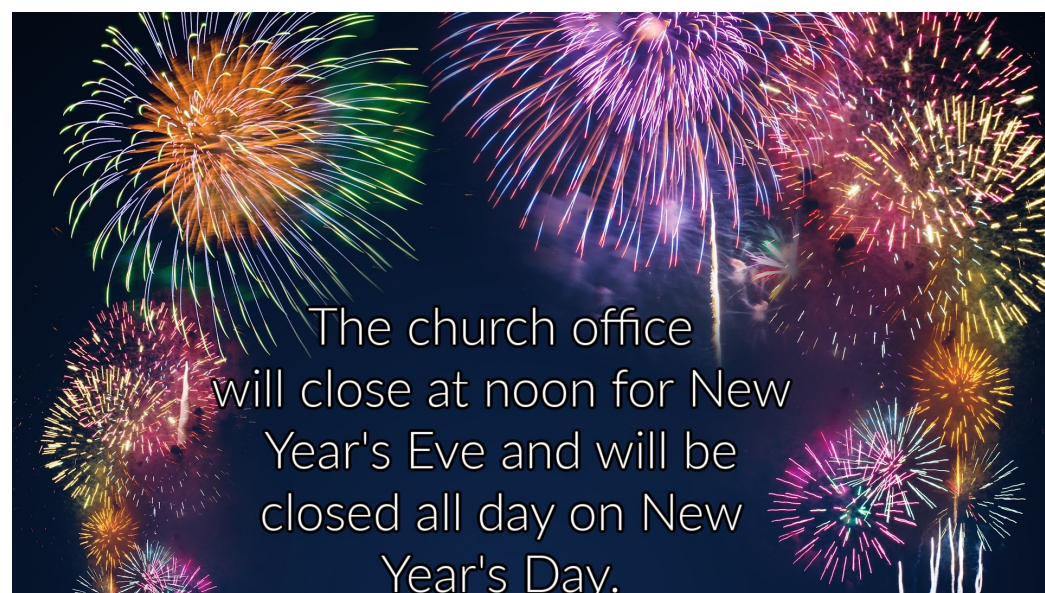
