According to recent studies, about 1 in 12 adults in America have an active substance use disorder. In addition, about 30% of adults misuse substances without showing any outward signs of a disorder. Research indicates that substances have a detrimental effect on one's health, including oral health.

Oftentimes dental providers are the health care professionals spending the most one-on-one time with patients. Therefore, they are able to screen and advise patients on this issue.
