Course Description:

The WHCT Yearbook class is a hands-on, creative course focused on producing the annual WHCT yearbook. In this class, students work together as a team to design, write, and organize a book that captures the memories, events, and people of the school year.

Students will take on both individual and group projects that help build skills in graphic design, basic writing and editing, organization, planning, and communication. As a class, students will make decisions about the yearbook's theme, cover design, fonts, colors, layouts, and what content is included.

Each student will need a laptop in class and will also need to attend at least one WHCT event to take photos, gather information, and collect quotes—learning how to think and work like a reporter.

Along the way, students will practice teamwork, leadership, time management, and professional communication skills such as email etiquette. By the end of the course, students will have helped create a published yearbook they can be proud of and look back on for years to come.



Commitment:

- This course meets once a week for half of the WHCT academic year.
- It is worth ½ credit for high school students, but is open to all students.
- 1-2 hour per week of assigned homework
- Keep up with the pace of the syllabus
- Graded Quarterly submissions and deadlines
- No Tests
- Grades based off of completed yearbook pages and assignments
