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Prerequisites:

- This course is open to 9th-12th grade students.



Course Description:

This survey of world history covers Creation through the Cold War and beyond. Students will develop an understanding of historical trends, philosophies, and events as they examine theories surrounding a period or topic, history makers who changed the course of events, comparative worldviews, and consider critical thinking questions. While we will learn about key events and personalities, we will also try to understand the flow of history. How and why did things happen? Students will also get to hear from voices from the past through selections from primary texts.



Commitment:

- This course is offered once a week.
- Weekly assignments should take 2-3 hours to complete, with projects requiring additional time.
- Work will include quizzes, tests, projects, and class participation.




A typical class will look like...
