

What does it take to provide cemetery maintenance and to maintain and restore the SHN church? It takes a diverse group of dedicated individuals that are willing to donate their precious time and energy. Since the original group of Trustees took on this task, there have been many people that have focused on continuing the goals set by the original trustees.

Work recently completed at SNH includes the cleaning of the attic, attic electrical installation, and then the attic insulation completed under the direction of **David Breyhan**. The future gazebo cement foundation labor and materials were donated by **Joel Melum**. An 8-foot, all weather picnic table donated by the **Loberg family** will be placed on the foundation this spring. When funds have been secured for the gazebo, the construction will begin.

Our current goals are to have storm windows installed for the entire church followed by insulating the exterior church walls. The beautiful stained glass windows should be protected from the elements. Also, the stained glass window above the front entry is in need of repair. There is a generous donor that has provided \$3,000 to kick-start this approximate \$10,500 project.

Sadie was a renowned local artist. Sadie attended Luther College in Decorah, Iowa. First-year Luther College students considering an art major have an opportunity to apply for


