

# South New Hope Cemetery and Church were blessed with a productive 2025!

The number of volunteers and attendees that came out to help at our work days and special events was tremendous. The camaraderie and joy of friends provided us with a fun environment while much work was accomplished.

Our monetary donors were a blessing. Six Thrivent Action Team Dollars were provided by sponsors, Roger Dobbe, Lucille Dobbe, and Don Romundson, to provide a total of \$1,500 in additional funds to support our 2 newsletters, 2 work days, the Pie Social, and the Wreaths Across America event. Since the publication of the Summer 2025 newsletter, much exterior work has been accomplished with the contracting of Nate Harms. The church's metal roof and steeple have been repainted. The front of the church, the bell tower, and small areas of peeling paint on the other sides of the building have been scraped, primed and painted. The biggest challenge for Nate was to reach the top of the steeple with his lift and he successfully completed the job!






## Sandra Ross & Brian Huglen Wedding

South New Hope Church provides a lovely setting for weddings and other special events. Unfortunately, the beautiful, ivory colored wallpaper that was professionally installed in our church in the 1960's is showing its age. The

glue has come through the wallpaper, the edges have lifted and the color has become mottled.

The Board of Trustees would like to restore the interior walls by stripping the old paper and giving the walls a fresh wall treatment. We hope you'll be inspired to support our restoration efforts with a generous gift.

#### A Quiet Sitting Place


