This is a great picture. The cross has a very special meaning at this time of year. I'm reminded that the message of the cross has not changed, but some of the ways we get the Gospel message out have changed somewhat.

One way we are helping three language groups that live along the river systems in northern Bolivia, is by solar powered radios. This man is a Trinitario who lives upriver. He traveled by canoe delivering a couple of these radios to isolated Trinitario family groups.



In faraway places the Holy Spirit is bringing conviction to lost souls. Isn't that refreshing to know? There is no place where God's Word doesn't have an effect, especially when it is delivered in the language of the people.

This family just received a solar radio. To this young family it could mean a lot to be able to hear what the Bible has to say in their language.





This last trip in January with God's help we loaded 800 micro chip SD cards and many flash drives. These flash drives and chips contain audio Bibles, Bible studies and music in the language of the people they go to. We are grateful for your prayers and financial help to make that possible.

In the Chimanes' new center, they can watch the Jesus film in their language. It sure beats sitting on the jungle floor, and it is pretty much bug free with nice chairs. They are grateful for all the financial help that has come to make this special building available.
