4/28/2024 Pastor's Corner THERE IS LIFE IN THE BLOOD

Leviticus 17:11

"The life of the flesh is in the blood; and I have given it to you, upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul"

Mocking the Bible by insisting it is bloody, oldfashioned, archaic, outdated and not relevant for today, does not change the truths found in it. A closer look at this text speaks of the value of the blood. Blood is vital for both the physical life and the spiritual life.

IT IS VITAL PHYSICALLY - "The life of the flesh is in the blood."

In the early years of our country, a common medical practice was to bleed people when they were sick. Though it was practiced by sincere doctors, it caused many to die that might have lived had they not been bled. Today, we know this practice is deadly. We have learned that there is life in the blood, and we give blood to people who are sick. We have blood drives to encourage people to give blood and to maintain a good supply of the different blood types. We have learned that "the life of the flesh is in the blood." The Bible is not so outdated as the mockers would claim. In fact, many deaths could have been prevented had people believed this Biblical text sooner.

IT IS VITAL SPIRITUALLY - "It is the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul."

While the blood is vital physically, it is also vital spiritually. Cain presented a bloodless sacrifice unto the Lord and failed. Many still try to remove or limit the blood in our hymn books by avoiding or removing songs that speak of the power in the blood. It is the blood of Christ that cleanses our sins. Friend, if you remove the blood from your theology, you are practicing the same failed attempts that bleeding does to the physical body. The blood of Christ is essential for cleansing one from sin. "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin." (I John 1:7). When Jesus instituted the Lord's supper, He said, "My blood ... which is shed ... for the remission of sins" (Matthew 26:28). The Apostle Paul said, "Being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him" (Romans 5:9); and "In whom we have redemption through his blood" (Ephesians 1:7). The Apostle Peter said "Ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold ... But with precious blood of Christ" (1 Peter 1:18, 19). To have your theology right and have your sins forgiven, you need the blood of Christ to do it.
