JUSTICE IN AN UNJUST NATION

Numbers 5:7

*They shall confess their sin which they have
done; and he shall recompense his trespass
with the principle thereof, and add unto it the
fifth part thereof, and give it unto him against
whom he hath trespassed.*

We would live in a much safer country if our
laws reflected the values of the laws that God
gave to Moses. These laws dealt with sin and vi-
olators of the law. These laws did not favor the
criminal over the victim. They protected individu-
als as well as property. Criminals were treated as
criminals and were not winked at or released the
same day. His laws never condoned sinful and
malicious behavior. Notice the guidelines.

REPENTANCE – *"They shall confess their sin which
they have done,"*

Confessing sin is being honest and admitting
that you have done wrong. Excusing or denying
one's violations or crime against humanity only
creates more problems and promotes the wrong
behavior. Confession is necessary for salvation
and for improving our country. Confession
acknowledges the crime or sinful act.

Acknowledging that you have done wrong or
sinned is humbling. Denying criminal behavior or
sin is a false attempt to maintain honor before
men. God is interested in holiness before Him.
Honoring God requires honesty and confession of
our sins toward Him and mankind.

RESTORATION – *"He shall recompense his
trespass".*

Repentance spoke of the person who had com-
mitted the sin or wrongdoing. Restoration ad-
dresses the person to whom the crime was done.
Restoration is part of repentance.

There must be restoration in justice. Our laws
often ignore the victim, but God's laws never do.
When we acknowledge and repent of the sinful or
malicious acts that we have committed, it must
involve restoration to those who have been
harmed by our wrongdoing. Saying I am sorry is
rarely enough. If your actions have hurt someone,
justice says restoration or "recompense."

The principal is *"... add unto it the fifth part
thereof."* The restoration amount is stated by God.
If you have stolen, you must give back what you
stole, and add 20 percent to the victim also. If we
lived by God's laws of recompense, there would
be no ambulance chasers or unreasonable law-
suits. Allowing justice to prevail will improve our
Nation.
