Sermon Outline

The Emmaus Road(2)

Luke 24:15-27



Intro: Two weeks ago, we covered verses 13-16:

In vs. 15-17 Jesus joined a couple as they walked and talked their way to Emmaus. He asked them two questions as He joined them: **What were they talking about?** and **Why were they sad?**

I. Their Lack of Faith – vs. 17–24

A. About the Conviction and Death of Jesus – vs. 18-21

B. About the Resurrection and the Empty Tomb – vs.21-24

Without Jesus, you will spend eternity in Hell.

Revelation 21:8 - *But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death.*

Matthew 25:30 - *And cast ye the unprofitable servant into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.*

Matthew 25:41 - *Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels:*

Matthew 25:46 - *And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal.*

Hebrews 11:6 - *But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.*

A. Their Foolishness – vs. 25-26

Matthew 5:22 - *But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, **Thou fool**, shall be in danger of hell fire.*

B. Their Lack of Knowledge – v. 27

Friends, it is the Scriptures that give us wisdom, understanding, and clarity about Jesus Christ.

Conclusion:

*Friends, if you want to see Jesus and get to know Him, get into the Word of God. You need to follow **your** road to Emmaus.*

Pastor's Corner

GOD'S MARCHING ORDERS

At the commandment of the LORD they rested in the tents, and at the commandment of the LORD they journeyed; they kept the charge of the Lord, at the commandment of the LORD by the hand of Moses. - Numbers 9:23

There were many stops and commands on the march to the land of Canaan.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAN -

"commandment of the Lord"

Three times this phrase is used in our text and "charge of the Lord" (which means the same thing) is found once. Like today, many folks do not want a life that has rules that interfere with their coming and going. Israel needed orders to know when to travel and when not to travel.

These orders in our text controlled the entire day for the Israelites. It was designed to help and protect them. Every minute was filled with God's orders. Are we allowing our daily life to be led of the Lord? This means that we listen to His instructions and follow His will for our life. When Israel complained and went their own way, they only found trouble.

Are we grateful that God cares enough to provide instructions for daily life?

INSTRUCTIONS KEPT BY MAN -

"Kept the charge of the Lord."

The Israelites kept this command. Obedience is not always easy. Being fatigued makes it easy to stop and rest. Getting started again and again, day after day with no promise of when the journey would end, makes it hard to stay put, but also hard to stop when you just want to get to Canaan. All the stops would seem to delay the getting to Canaan. I am not sure when the question began, but it makes us think,

"Are we there yet?"

Obedience allowed rest but also provisions. The manna came each day where God put their camp. If they did not obey the Lord, they would go hungry.

Are we taking advantage of the Daily Bread that God provides through The Word of God?

INSTRUCTIONS OVERLOOKED BY MAN -

"At the commandment of the LORD they rested in their tents."

This first command in our text is often overlooked. It is the order to rest. When we think of commands, we usually think of work or action. God commands both work and rest. We like action, but we need to stop and rest awhile to renew our strength. Jesus told his disciples to "Come ye part ... and rest awhile" in Mark 6:31. I have heard it said that if you don't come apart and rest awhile, you might just come apart. Resting allows our body and mind to re-group for the journey.

Isaiah 40:31 - But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.

There is a balance to both rest and work. How are you doing in the area of resting or renewing your strength? Personally, I still struggle with the resting part.
