
We had already heard of the place, the College Creamery on the campus of the College of the Ozarks, inside the Keeter Center. The full-time students at this Christian based university get

In Memoriam

Long time member **Marvin Blough** (July 12, 1938 – October, 28, 1924) hailing from a farm in Iowa. He was remembered for his years helping with the club's tractor pulls and his cheerful demeanor.
