As of June 24, 2025 the accounts have the following balances.


General account \$24,647.37 Bingo account \$16,325.09 Building account \$84,355.42 Lottery account \$10,110.94 Poppy account \$93,733.57

Since Dominion Command will be raising their share of our dues by \$4.00 effective January 1, 2026, the amount we have to pay will be \$43.51 per person. Therefore, the rate for those 75 and over could not be kept at \$40.00. It was voted on and past at the last General Meeting to raise the senior rate from \$40.00 to \$50.00 effective 1 September.




