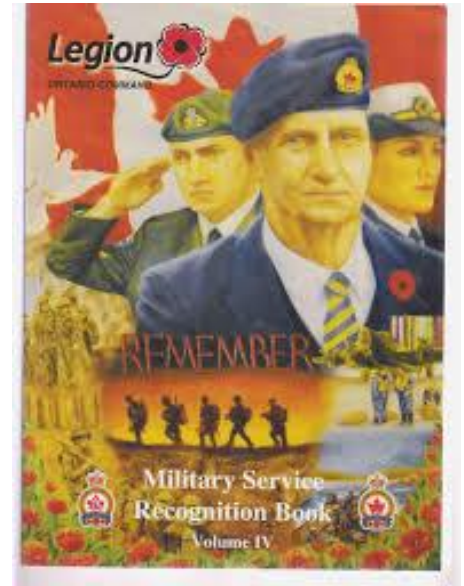

William George Barker, VC, DSO & Bar, MC & Two Bars (3 November 1894 – 12 March 1930) was a Canadian First World War fighter ace and Victoria Cross recipient. He is the most decorated serviceman in the history of Canada. Known for receiving the Victoria Cross (VC) and the Distinguished Service Order (DSO) during World War I, he was an exceptionally decorated pilot, credited with 50 confirmed air victories, and is remembered for his extraordinary bravery.

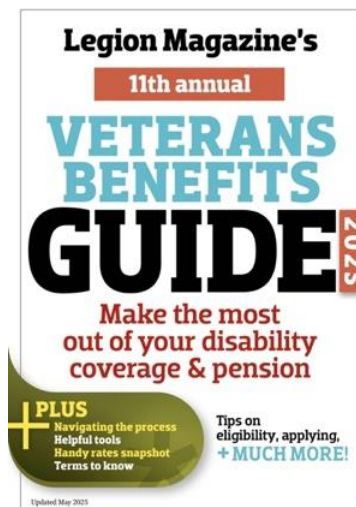

Canadian Coast Guard Joins Defence Team

The Department of National Defence (DND) has formally integrated the Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) into the Defence Team following an Order in Council signed the week of August 31, 2025.

The change, officials say, sharpens whole-of-government coordination at sea—especially in the Arctic—while preserving the Coast Guard’s civilian identity intact.

Canada has finalized a contract to procure **88 F-35A Lightning II fighter jets** from the U.S. government and Lockheed Martin, with Pratt & Whitney, as part of its Future Fighter Capability Project (FFCP).

Key considerations for the next big gun



Key considerations for the next big gun include **mobility** and **ground mobility**, as modern battlefields prioritize speed and the ability to move quickly after firing. Other crucial factors are **range**, **protection** from blast overpressure, and the **suitability of the weapon system** for the intended purpose, such as new infrastructure requirements for artillery regiments, service battalions, and supply depots.

The Legion's Structure is Composed of Three Levels.



Dominion Command

Dominion Command is the national headquarters and is responsible for all national advocacy, Veteran representation and assistance, national program development and administrative oversight of the organization.

On a national level, positions and policies are determined by the Dominion Executive Council (DEC), the national governing body of The Royal Canadian Legion. DEC members are comprised of the Dominion President and the Senior Elected Officers, elected by the membership at Dominion Convention. DEC also includes the President of each Provincial Command and

Special Section.

Legion Headquarters is the administrative and operation arm of Dominion Command. Legion Headquarters develops and facilitates national programs, administers memberships, oversees the Veterans Services Department and supports the Service Officers at the Command levels.



Provincial Command

Provincial Commands have an executive elected by members within the Command. They provide direction and support to their branches and ensure they abide by Legion By-laws. Each

Command has trained professional Command Service Officers who assist Veterans with benefit applications and support. Provincial Commands also develop provincial programs and initiatives to meet Veteran needs. Provincial Commands hold Provincial Conventions every two years to determine provincial policies and direction for the Command.



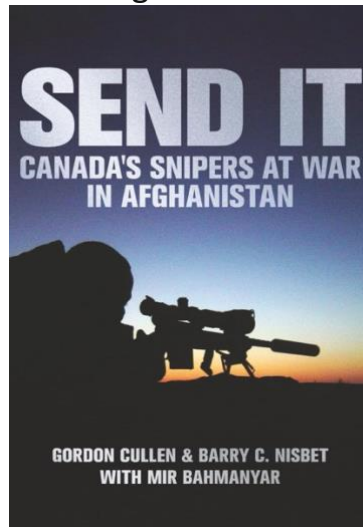
Legion Branch

Legion Branches are autonomous and independently operated. Their policies and activities are defined by their membership in accordance with Legion By-laws, allowing them to meet the needs of local Veterans and support their community. Branches have an elected executive and committees that guide their activities, and volunteer Service Officers who can assist local Veterans and refer them to the Provincial Command for specialized help.

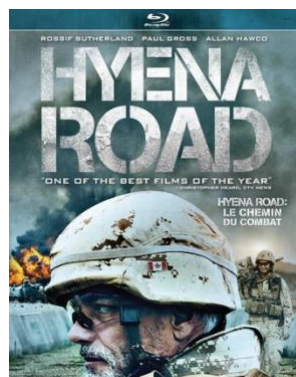

8 December 1915 – Punch magazine publishes "In Flanders Fields."

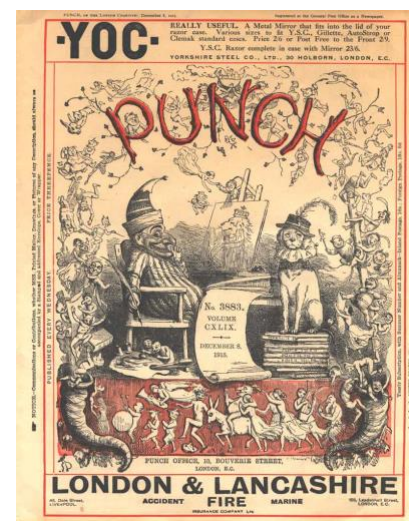
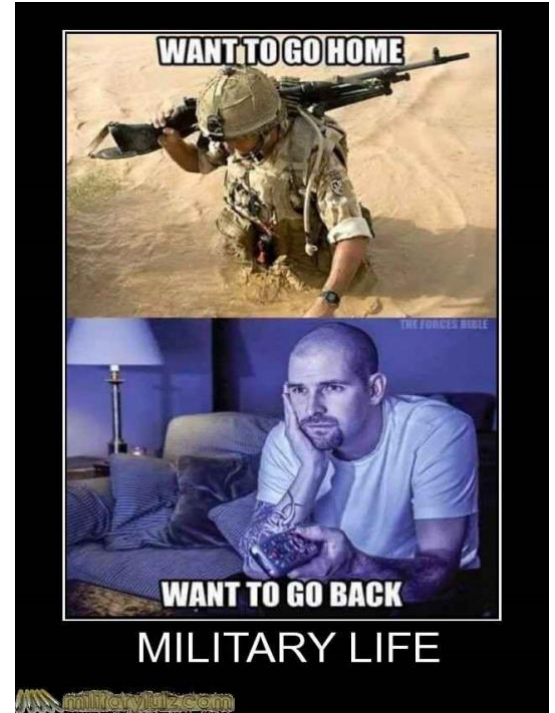
17 December 1917 – Military nurses and female relatives of Canadian soldiers are allowed to vote for the first time in a federal election.

20 December 1943 – Canadian forces begin their flight to capture the Italian town of Ortona in a battle renowned for its vicious Street fighting.

24 December 1914 – An unofficial Christmas truce begins on the Western Front.

28 December 1945 – Brigadefuhrer Kurt Meyer is found guilty of war crimes at a Canadian military court in Germany for the murder of Canadian soldiers at Abbaye d'Ardenne, France.

Includes still serving and retired military, reservists, RCMP, police officers, Canadian Coast Guard, and others listed in the General By-Laws.

Associate membership

Includes parents, spouses, widows, widowers, children, grandchildren, siblings, nieces as well as nephews of a person who is or was eligible for Ordinary membership.

Affiliate voting membership

Includes Canadian citizens or Commonwealth subjects from an Allied nation who support The Royal Canadian Legion's aims and objectives, and are not eligible for ordinary or associate membership through service or family association.

Affiliate non-voting membership

This includes non-Canadian citizens or non-Commonwealth subjects from an Allied nation who support The Royal Canadian Legion's aims and objectives.

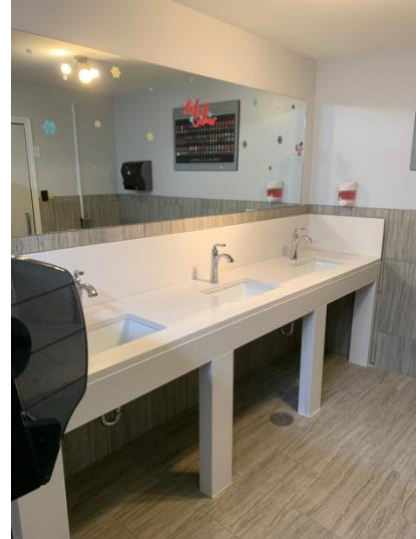

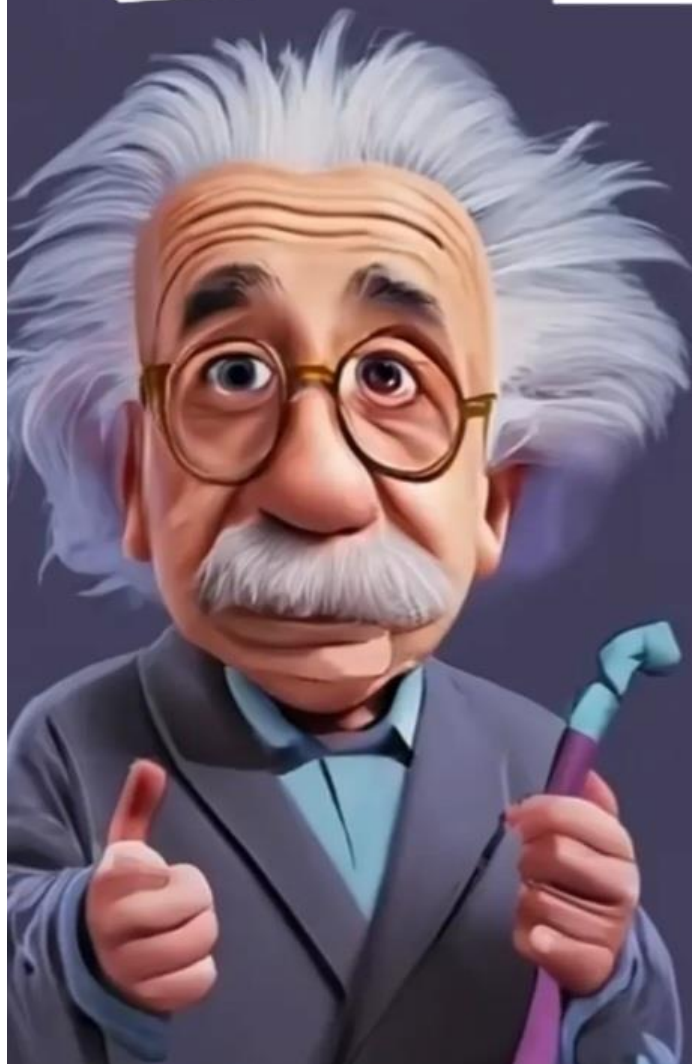

CLUBHOUSE RULES

1. Provisions for Admittance:

A – no one under the age of 19 years permitted in these premises without the permission of the Executive Committee, except for the following events:

Restaurant hours up to 9 p.m.	Special Dinners
Wedding receptions	Wakes
Showers	Private parties

B – All persons under the age of 19 must leave the premises by 9 p.m. at the discretion of the bar steward.

C – No dogs or other animals will be permitted in the building with the exception of service dogs.

2. A - Proper dress code shall always be in effect.

B - Headgear is not to be worn in the Members Lounge, except by the Sergeant-at-Arms or Parade Commander, while on duty, or as permitted on special occasions, or by other personnel for whom wearing headgear is mandatory. (Religious or medical)

C - Conduct within the Branch must be indicative of Royal Canadian Legion standards. No unnecessary noise, foul language or loud conversation of any description will be permitted.

3. Legion members from other branches are requested to sign the Guest Book.

4. Ontario Regulations made under the Liquor License Act stipulates that the steward on duty operates under AGCO guidelines and Legion policy regarding bar operations in general. Members and Guests shall not interfere with that authority. No member or guest shall remain in the building after the regular closing times.

5. All members utilizing the facilities of the Lounge must return their glasses, pitchers, etc., to the bar.


6. In the event that any Member or Guest be guilty of misconduct, it will be the responsibility of the steward to take immediate action. If said misconduct continues, the steward has the

authority to ask the Member and/or Guest to leave and will report the incident to the Executive Committee for action.

7. Each Member is equally responsible to assist the steward and Executive Committee in maintaining proper order and conduct in the Branch at all times.
8. If a Member or Guest is refused service by the bar steward and any Member supplies him or her with another alcoholic beverage, he or she must leave the premises.
9. Service areas at the bar must be kept clear. No loitering.
10. No property belonging to Branch 644 is to be loaned or taken out of the Branch without the approval of the House Chair.
11. No games on dart boards, pool tables or shuffleboard may be started after Last Call has been announced by the bar steward.
12. Members, Guests or Staff are not permitted to use electronic devices for any illicit purposes: such as gambling, watching of movies, pornography.
13. No smoking, Vaping or cannabis products on Legion property.
14. The wearing of OMC/street gang colours is not permitted at Legion events and premises, as this is contrary to the Legion's articles of Faith and disrespectful of the sacrifices made by our Veterans
