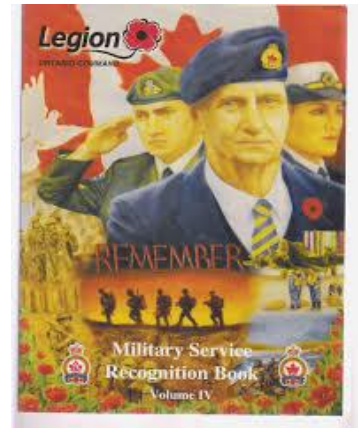
VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER REPORT: WAYNE GOSSE, CD, SGT (RET'D)

The Legion's First Dominion Convention — January 24, 1927

The Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League was formally incorporated by a Special Act of Parliament on July 17, 1926, giving the organization a permanent foundation to support Veterans, lead Remembrance initiatives, and establish Branches nationwide.

Just months later, representatives from over 800 Branches and more than 20,000 members gathered in Winnipeg for the first Dominion Convention. National committees were formed to address issues important to Veterans, laying the groundwork for programs that continue to support communities today—including the Poppy Campaign.

This historic gathering set the foundation for a unified national voice for Veterans—a legacy that continues 100 years later.

Comrade Marion won a beautiful bouquet of flowers and received a thank you card from the Windsor Chapel. Couldn't have happened to a nicer person. Congrats Marion!





Celebrating 100 years: The Royal Canadian Legion launches 2026 Centenary brand.

The Royal Canadian Legion began in 1925 as [The Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League](#), formed from merged WWI veterans' groups to advocate for vets. Incorporated in 1926, it grew to support veterans of later conflicts, adding "Royal" in 1960 after Queen Elizabeth II's consent. Today, it's Canada's largest veteran support and community service organization, known for its Poppy Campaign and dedication to Canadian Armed Forces, RCMP, and their families, advocating for justice, honour, and remembrance.

The Persian Gulf War – 35 Years Later.



Royal Canadian Navy Veterans played a crucial role during the Gulf War.

Canada deployed three ships: HMC Ships Athabaskan, Protecteur and Terra Nova.

Their first arrival was in September 1990, joining the Multinational Interception Force (MIF).

Their mission? Intercept vessels bound to ports in Iraq and Kuwait.

The three Canadian ships represented less than 10% of the MIF naval forces, but accounted for over a quarter of the interceptions between September and December 1990.

Navy personnel carried out other assignments such as escorting and replenishing other nations' warships and vessels.

Agile Combat Employment: RCAF's success in TARASSIS



The Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) successfully concluded its participation in TARASSIS, a Joint Expeditionary Force (JEF)-led multinational rehearsal that took place in October. Operating from Ämari Air Base in Estonia, Canadian assets also conducted operations across Europe, including Finland, Lithuania, and Latvia reinforcing Canada's capabilities and commitment in NATO's area of responsibility.

TARASSIS marks a significant milestone for the RCAF, showcasing its ability to operate in contested, degraded, and operationally limited environments. Central to this success was the implementation of Agile Combat Employment (ACE) and Agile Operations Employment (AOE), two strategic concepts that redefine how air forces deploy, sustain, and fight.

Soldiers loaded an M777 howitzer aboard an RCAF CC-130J as part of preparations for Op NANOOK-NUNALIVUT. Members of 1 RCHA will conduct fire missions in Cambridge Bay, Nunavut, marking the first time the M777 system will be this far North in the Arctic and a historic moment for the Canadian Army in its mission to protect Canada's North.

To become an Associate or Affiliate member, they have to pay for 2027. If they pay for 2027, they are automatically entered in the draw for the Ford F150 pickup. People who are already paid-up members for 2026 are entered in the draw. The centenary members do not get to vote at a meeting or an election.

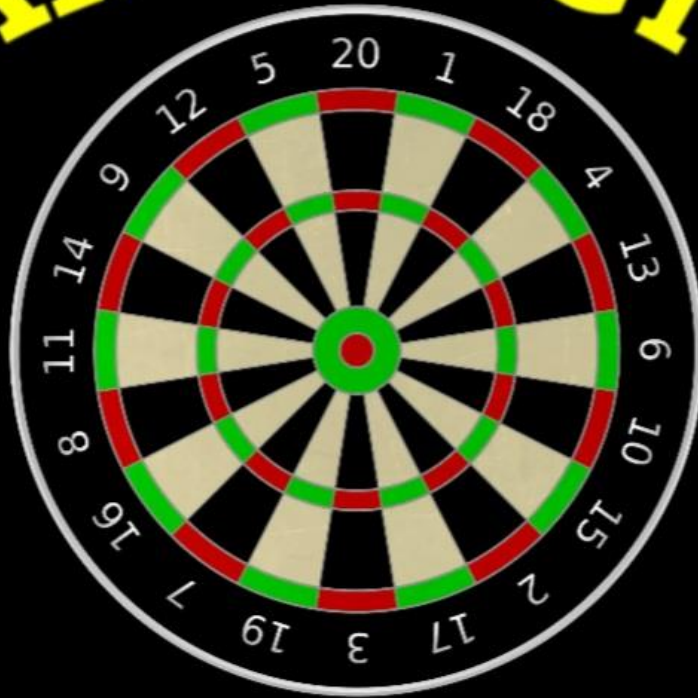
