### **Introduction to the Psalm.**

#### **The King of glory is the sovereign creator king.**

1. He is the creator.  
(1-2; Genesis 1 & 2; John 1:1-3; Colossians 1:16-7); Psalm 90:1-2; Isaiah 40:28)
2. He is the ruler of His creation.  
(1-2; 1 Chronicles 29:11; Psalm 29:10; Acts 17:24; Revelation 19:6)

#### **The King of glory is the holy king.**

1. What does it mean to be holy? (3; Acts 3:14, 4:27; Hebrews 7:26)
2. Why is this important? (4; 1 Peter 1:19; Revelation 5:11, 13)

#### **The King of glory's people.**

1. Who are the King of glory's people?  
(3-4; Genesis 15:6; Psalm 25; Ecclesiastes 7:20; Matthew 5:8; Acts 15:9; Ephesians 2:8-9)
2. How do the King of glory's people maintain full fellowship with Him?  
(4-5; Psalm 25; James 3:2; 1 John 1:8-9)

## In My Life This Week

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

**Monday.** After Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem He went to the temple and drove out the merchants, asserting His authority over the temple. He is God the Son, the sovereign creator. Review the first two verses of Psalm 24 and reflect again on this part of who Jesus, the King of glory, is.

**Tuesday.** Verse 3 reminds us that our King is holy. What does *holy* mean? What are some ways which display Christ's holiness? We are to be holy (see 1 Peter 1:16). Are you growing in holiness?

**Wednesday.** Verse 3 in effect asks "Who are, who can be the King of glory's people?" The answer is in verse 4. Remember then and now the only way to be accepted by God is His way, to come to Him by His provision in faith. Thank God for drawing you to Himself, and pray for those you know who have not yet accepted Christ.

**Thursday.** Believers are holy in Christ, and God builds that character in us as we follow Him faithfully. Verse 4 speaks of having clean hands and a pure heart. Check Psalm 15 for examples of what holiness looks like in daily life. How are you doing?

**Friday – Saturday.** On Sunday we plan to think about *Looking into the mirror on Resurrection Morning*. Read through 1 Corinthians chapter 15 in preparation for our time together.
