If you've never heard of this program, you're probably wondering what is a vial of life? The "Vial of Life" project provides a senior's medical history and other vital information to emergency medical personnel so they can administer potentially life-saving treatments. The free "Vial of Life" kit consists of a medical information form, plus decals to let responding emergency medical workers know this information is available.

A form is included in the Welcome Wagon packet. If you choose to fill it in, keep it in a place where medics can easily locate. Many people place the vial in the freezer.

Mid Florida Lakes Amenities

- Boat Marina Slips-Covered and Uncovered

- There are locks close to our community that are used to move boats through water bodies of different elevations. There are three locks within our district: Moss Bluff Lock on the Ocklawaha River, Apopka-Beauclair Lock on the Apopka-Beauclair Canal and the Burrell Lock on Haynes Creek.

- Two (2) pools. The larger pool is heated. There are tables, chairs and water devices available. The far side is available to those who smoke and a small screened in building for lunches and/or small events.
- Trash pick-up-Tuesday & Friday at 8:00 am.
- Recyclables Monday-8:00 am. Containers available at MFL office.
- Storage for campers, boats, trailers, etc...
- Woodshop.
- Air hose-outside of the woodshop.
- Weekly emails with the latest community news (see Barbara Painter for more information).
- "Pet Park".
- (4) pool tables.
- Community Card Games.

Community

Clubhouse

The clubhouse is the main building located near the entrance of the community. The clubhouse hosts holiday and community gatherings, meetings, dinners, dances, parties, plays, birthdays, reunions

and memorials. It is where the community goes to vote, drinks coffee, watch television and socialize.

The Clubhouse consists of;

The **Small Hall** which has its entrance under the overhead roof. Provides:

- Free coffee/tea for Home Owners Association members.
- A lounge area with a television.
- Tables for card playing, dominos, mahjongg, bridge, and board games.
- The room where tickets sales for all community events can be purchased (every Wednesday from 10:00 am-11:00 am.)

The **Large Hall** is located at the far end of the building.

This Hall:

- Includes the Activities Director's office where "Concern & Compliment" forms are available outside the Activity Director's door.
- Hosts Wednesday night and Thursday afternoon bingo and all stage performances.
- Provides a handicap parking area on the side and a bathroom next to the stage.
- Holds the community's larger activities & events.

The <u>Right Hallway</u> links the Small and Large Hall. This area has the HOA office, the library, the computer room, the pool hall, and the kitchen. The <u>Left Hallway</u> leads to the gym Ceramic room and bathrooms.

Emergency Response Team

The Emergency Response Team (ERT) offers a voluntary service for residents of Mid Florida Lakes. ERT will keep a file of your emergency information and contacts to assist if an unfortunate situation arises. Contact ERT if you would like your information on file. What does the Emergency Response Team do?

The Team:

- helps prepare you for disasters.
- has wheel chairs, walkers, crutches, potty chairs and shower chairs.
- does home fire inspections.
- disposes of old medicines and needles.
- trains for disasters to help you.
- trains in first aid.
- trains in CPR.
- can take your blood pressure.
- trains how to use the A.E.D. (Automated External Defibrillator)
- trains what to do in case of a tornado.
- trains what to do in case of an emergency.
- is always looking for new members.

We have trained officers and members that are always here to help you.
