Watering Restrictions

*Irrigation is prohibited between 10am and 4 pm

*Residential irrigation at **odd numbered** addresses or no addresses is allowed **Wednesday & Saturday.**

*Residential irrigation at even numbered addresses is allowed on Thursday & Sunday.

*Irrigation is limited to no more that 3/4 inch of water and/or to no more than one hour per zone per irrigation day.

*Irrigation using a micro-spry, micro-jet, drip or bubbler irrigation system is allowed anytime.

*Irrigation using a hand-held hose equipped with a spray nozzle that can be adjusted so water flows only as needed is allowed anytime. As per the St Johns River Management District
