Wishing everyone a beautiful month ahead filled with activities, appreciation, and community pride.





Tips & Tricks

Seed Starting: If you're starting from scratch (like me!), try one of these easy, reliable mixes—available at Walmart-Jiffy Natural & Organic Seed Starter Mix, Espoma Organic Seed Starter, Miracle-Gro Seed Starting and Potting Mix

Plant Now: Arugula • Chinese Cabbage • Peppers • Kohlrabi • Sugarcane • Spinach

Watering Tip: Water deeply but less often. Always water at a time of day when foliage and soil can dry quickly. Plants that stay wet too long are more likely to develop disease, stem rot, or root rot.

Watch For: Keep an eye out for: leaf miners, aphids, caterpillars, mites, slugs, and snails.

Pest Control: These plant based options are considered safer and effective for most gardens: Pyrethrin, Rotenone, Neem Oil, and Spinosad

Composting: Great additions to natural compost include- Coconut coir • Manure • Vegetable scraps • Fruit peels • Dead plants • Coffee grounds • Egg shells • Old bread

Fun Tricks: Mix marigolds or mint into your veggie beds to naturally deter pests. Aphids dislike aluminum foil—placing strips around plant bases can discourage them. Beer Traps (1 tsp dried yeast + 3 tps. water) help deter several nuisance bugs.

Mid Florida Lakes Church



During the month of March our church will conclude our 40 Days of Prayer that we began the last week of January. We have experienced God move in many different ways through several people. We also had a really good time at Movie Night on Sunday night February 22.

This year March has 5 Sundays! Palm Sunday March 29th is the last Sunday in March. On this Sunday, your church will continue our annual tradition by celebrating Christ in the Passover. For more than four thousand years, the Jewish people have celebrated Passover as an annual event. Over the course of that time, the special Seder celebrating the first Passover itself has changed extraordinarily little, **but many people do not realize Passover is not only for Jews, it is for Christians as well.** This is our way of following the traditions of the Old Testament while also celebrating the Christ of the New Testament.



Our Seder is a celebration of Passover that includes a “play by play” description of the events of the “Last Supper.” Traditionally, a Seder is an evening or supper meal, however, due to scheduling we hold our Christian Seder as part of our Sunday service. The event begins at 10 am on Sunday, March 29 and will last for two hours. Our church makes every effort to make sure that the meal features traditional Jewish food items.

Please arrive a few minutes early (we start promptly at 10:00) so all can be seated, and plan to stay for the entire event. **This is a free event however, to help us plan the special food required for the Passover service, we request that you RSVP by March 23.** People can sign up any of the following ways: First by contacting any of Mid-Florida Lakes church regular attendees. Secondly, by signing up at one of the church Sunday morning gatherings. Finally, by contacting Gay Connors at 352-400-0456.

Calendar for March: First Sunday – Communion followed by our monthly luncheon and Board Meeting; 2nd Sunday – Birthdays; 5th Sunday March 29th is Psalm Sunday and our celebration of a Christian Seder. A quick additional note. Easter Sunday, April 5th we will celebrate with a sunrise service and a regular service both in the small hall.

If you have never attended one of our services come check us out. We begin our Sunday mornings at 9:30am in the large hall with a fellowship breakfast followed by service at 10. Our services have been and will continue to be broadcast on our Facebook page. The beauty of the Facebook broadcasts is all the lessons are available, so people can go back and catch up on any week that they might have missed. If you can't visit in person, look us up on Facebook, we broadcast there weekly (Mid Florida Lakes Church).

May God continue to bless you and give you peace. Amen

Veteran Benefits & In-Home Care: Lake County Veterans Services (352-742-6585) helps veterans navigate Florida and federal benefits, file VA disability claims, request military records, and obtain ID cards—ensuring access to all earned entitlements.

Veterans Care Coordination (855-380-4400): Provides support with the VA Pension with Aid & Attendance benefit, helping veterans and surviving spouses with the application process and coordinating Homemaker Home Health Aide Care.

Personal Safety & Wellness-Senior Watch Program: The Senior Watch Program (352-343-2101, LCSO Non-Emergency Line) offers daily check-in calls for individuals living alone or with medical issues. If a participant does not call in, operators will attempt contact and dispatch a Deputy Sheriff if needed to ensure their safety.

Seniors vs. Crime Hotline (1-800-203-3099): A dedicated resource for seniors facing scams, fraud, or deceptive practices, helping victims reclaim their money and restore their peace of mind.




