We're dedicated to ensuring seniors and veterans receive the essential services they've earned. From daily wellness checks and in-home support to protection against financial scams, here's a quick overview of key local and statewide resources available to you and your loved ones.

For daily living support, contact the Lake County Elder Options Helpline at 1-800-262-2243 (Mon-Fri, 8AM-5PM). They provide Meals on Wheels, housekeeping help, caregiver support, and free Medicare counseling through the SHINE program. This helpline serves as the main gateway to local aging resources.

Lake County Senior Services (352-326-3540): Your main contact for general senior service inquiries and local program information.

Veteran Benefits & In-Home Care: Lake County Veterans Services (352-742-6585) helps veterans navigate Florida and federal benefits, file VA disability claims, request military records, and obtain ID cards—ensuring access to all earned entitlements.

Veterans Care Coordination (855-380-4400): Provides support with the VA Pension with Aid & Attendance benefit, helping veterans and surviving spouses with the application process and coordinating Homemaker Home Health Aide Care.

Personal Safety & Wellness—Senior Watch Program: The Senior Watch Program (352-343-2101, LCSO Non-Emergency Line) offers daily check-in calls for individuals living alone or with medical issues. If a participant does not call in, operators will attempt contact and dispatch a Deputy Sheriff if needed to ensure their safety.

Seniors vs. Crime Hotline (1-800-203-3099): A dedicated resource for seniors facing scams, fraud, or deceptive practices, helping victims reclaim their money and restore their peace of mind.

Attorney General Fraud Hotline (1-866-9-NO-SCAM / 1-866-966-7226): For reporting consumer fraud, scams, and deceptive business practices throughout Florida.

Durable Medical Equipment (DME): Christine Daily – 352-217-8517 (Call before 10 PM)
Provides a wide range of mobility and personal care equipment—including wheelchairs, walkers, and shower chairs—readily available for resident use throughout the community.

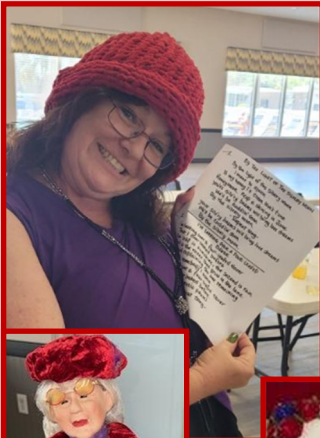

March Coffee Social Recap: Elder Options Shares Vital Resources for Adults 55+

Residents who attended our March Coffee Social enjoyed an enlightening and engaging presentation by **Amanda Sparkman**, a guest speaker from **Elder Options**, the Area Agency on Aging and Aging & Disability Resource Center serving North Central Florida. Amanda shared a wealth of information about the many programs and services available to adults 55+, their caregivers, and families in our community. Elder Options provides trusted, unbiased support and connects individuals to essential resources that promote independence, safety, and improved quality of life. Key Takeaways from Amanda's Presentation

The Elder Helpline: A One Call Connection to Support

Amanda highlighted the importance of the **Elder Helpline (800-262-2243)**, a free resource that helps callers locate local assistance such as transportation, Meals on Wheels, utility help, in-home services, legal resources, emergency alert systems, Medicare guidance, and more. Home & Community Based Services

Elder Options also guides families through eligibility and screening for home-based and long-term care programs, including Medicaid services that help older adults remain safely at home whenever possible. [\[agingresources.org\]](http://agingresources.org)

Caregiver Support & Training

Recognizing the challenges caregivers face, Amanda shared details on Elder Options' supportive programs offering stress-management tools, burnout prevention, and personalized or group coaching. She also touched on statewide resources such as the **RELIEF Program** for respite care, the **Home Care for the Elderly (HCE)** subsidy program, and the **Alzheimer's Disease Initiative (ADI)**, which provides training and extended respite for caregivers assisting loved ones with memory disorders.

SHINE: Free Medicare Counseling

A highlight of the session was information about **SHINE (Serving Health Insurance Needs of Elders)**—a free service offering unbiased, confidential Medicare counseling. Specially trained volunteers help with Medicare coverage questions, plan comparisons, billing issues, and cost-saving programs, and provide fraud-prevention support through the Senior Medicare Patrol.

SHINE operates statewide through the Florida Department of Elder Affairs and local Area Agencies on Aging, including Elder Options. [\[agingresources.org\]](http://agingresources.org) [\[floridashine.org\]](http://floridashine.org)

Aging & Disability Resource Centers (ADRCs)

Amanda also emphasized Florida's ADRC network, which provides a coordinated access point for long-term care information, benefits counseling, and a statewide resource database for seniors and caregivers. [\[elderaffairs.org\]](http://elderaffairs.org)

Other Important Programs

Residents learned about additional statewide offerings, including meal programs, energy assistance for low income households, Alzheimer's support services, and the PACE program for adults 55+ eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid. [\[seniorsite.org\]](http://seniorsite.org)

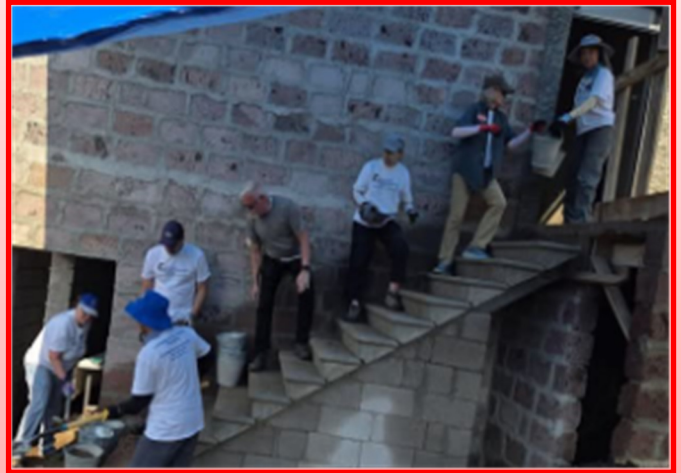

Greetings from Mid Florida Lakes the HOA board!

We wanted to give you quick update.

We are working hard to try to cut some of our costs and use the money that we save on your behalf wisely. You, the members, elected us to represent you. We take this responsibility seriously; we have been meeting several times a month looking at events and procedures to see if any changes are needed and how we can make improvements to make things better for all.



Many of us are of the age that, when something happens, we must call for life saving help. It would help the emergency crews (and help you especially) when they arrive if all your medical information was readily available to them. There is available what is called a vial of life. This is a small container that contains all the pertinent information (allergies are just one example of things they should know to help you) that the paramedics may need, especially if you are unable to answer their questions when they arrive. When a person is unable to communicate, all the information is readily available to the proper professionals in the vial of life. These vials are available in the HOA office, so feel free to contact any board member to get one or come by the office when the HOA is open, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM.

There are several safety tips for you we'd also like to recommend. This is the time of the year that taxes are due, and the clocks were set forward. The batteries in your smoke detectors should be changed so that they're working properly if the need should ever arise, so please don't wait till it beeps. Change your furnace filters monthly, doing so will result in much cleaner air being circulated in your home and that will be much healthier for you. Lastly check your dryer vent for lint. Unchecked, it creates a fire hazard and prevents the dryer from drying the contents of the dryer properly. Most people check the little lint basket where the clothes are loaded in, but if you can, check the vent behind the dryer. It can build up over time and create a potential fire hazard.

Friends Helping Friends

Friends Helping Friends. What is it? And how does it affect you as a resident of Mid Florida Lakes?

Several years ago, an organization "Friends Helping Friends" was created to assist a resident in a time of financial need; however, since it is a grant, not a loan to be repaid, it can only be used once during a person's residency and to qualify there are certain procedures and some restrictions.

The following is a description of the policies that were instituted on November 1, 2015: the Chairperson of the Friends Helping Friends Committee requesting monies/food gift cards will follow the procedure as outlined below.

The Chairperson is the first point of contact. All others on the committee will refer any requests to the Chairperson. (To respect and keep confidentiality, a friend or associate of the resident cannot request any funds, nor can the Chairperson solicit this person. It can only be requested by the residents themselves. The Chairperson will ask the resident the reason for the request, the amount requested and the name of the individual, or agency the check will be made out to, along with a copy of the bill to be paid. (Examples: car repairs, utility bills, glasses, etc.)

A confidential log will be kept by the Chairperson for the purpose of keeping track of the usage, the reason, and the amount. There is a limited maximum of up to 10 percent of the current bank account available, as we want to have monies available to others who may need assistance. (Note, as the fund or bank balance goes down, so do the available funds. Example, if a resident requests money and there is x amount of dollars in the fund, the total available will be reduced by that amount, and a lower amount available to the next recipient.) By the same token, if funds are replenished, a higher amount may be available for the next resident.

The Treasurer of the HOA/FHF is notified of said request by the Chairperson or in their absence, the designated substitute, the name of the agency/individual to which the check is to be made. The name of the resident is not given to the Treasurer, nor to any of the other committee members. The Chairperson presents the check to the resident who will then be responsible for giving it to the appropriate agency, or business.

If the request is for food: The Chairperson will go to a grocery store where the resident shops, purchase a gift card, and present it to the resident.

In the event of a catastrophic event, such as a fire, in which there is a total loss within the community, the Chairperson will notify the Treasurer of the HOA to issue a check, not to exceed 10 percent of the current account. The check will be written to the resident, once it is established the resident plans to continue to live within the community of Mid Florida Lakes. This will enable the resident to get emergency essentials quicker.

Any *resident who requests assistance from Friends Helping Friends must meet the required one-year residency. and any requested funds cannot be used to pay a resident's rent.

*For the determination of all monies/food gift cards dispersed by Friends Helping Friends, all references to "RESIDENT" are defined by the words, "Whomever is the person responsible for paying the lot rent residency fees." Any other person within the household is not eligible to request or receive funds/food or gift cards.

Our funds are limited so any donations to Friends Helping Friends are gratefully appreciated and accepted.

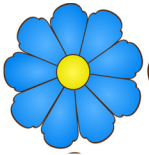

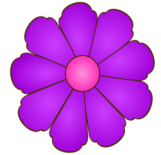
