How long have you been in this position?

“Since we opened in April of 2024.

I have been a Pharmacist since May 2021.”



A little about this business-

“Family Health Centers is a Federally Qualified Health Center that provides high-quality care where everyone is welcome. Our mission is to provide access to high quality primary and preventive care services without regard to the ability to pay. At our Iroquois location, located in the Hazelwood shopping center, we offer primary care, pediatrics, women's health and an immediate care center. All are welcome at Family Health Centers - and even if you have another primary care provider, we would be more than happy to see you at our immediate care center. I am the Pharmacist-In-Charge, and in order to use our pharmacy, you do have to see a primary care provider at Family Health Centers.”

Favorite part of the job-

“My favorite part of my job is building relationships with patients from the area. I grew up not far from Hazelwood, off of Dixie Highway, so I enjoy meeting people from the area and learning all about the hidden gems and businesses in the area. I love seeing my patients out in the community and getting to interact with them.”

Why Hazelwood?

“I love the close-knit community that Hazelwood is. It is neat to see businesses that have been here for a long time (Save-A-Lot) and to see the community look out for one another. I have had patients offer to pay for other patients' medications when they couldn't afford their prescriptions.”



Dare to Care Community Resources

To find resources in your zip code:

1. Go to www.daretocare.org and click on the green box that says "need food?"
2. Type your address or zip code into the box.



Types of help:

-  Pantry – gives out canned and boxed foods; sometimes has fresh fruits and vegetables
-  Distribution Center – has pantry; also has other services (help with bills, food closet, etc.)
-  Kid's Café – serves hot meals for kids ages 6 to 18; also has fun and educational activities
-  Mobile Pantry – has pantry set up only at certain times
-  Soup Kitchen – serves hot meals for adults

Please call sites before visiting to check your eligibility for services. Mobile Pantries may be canceled due to holidays, scheduling conflicts, or weather conditions too dangerous for the public.
