MONEY IS ATTRACTED TO MANAGEMENT

Genesis 2:4-15

There are many ways to get money. You can work for it, you can steal it, you can create it or you can **ATTRACT** it. Most people work for it. However, very few people attract it.

The Lord wants His people to attract money. The difference between working for money and attracting money is the **EFFORT** a person puts in. If you are tired of putting in the effort to get money this teaching will deliver you from toiling over money.

HOW TO ATTRACT MONEY

If you **MANAGE** the money you **CURRENTLY** have you will attract **MORE** money. Money is attracted to the allure

of great management practices. Every financial system in the world rewards great management practices and the Kingdom of God is no different. Here are a couple of examples.

- When you MANAGE and pay your credit card bills on time every month the credit company will award you with a higher credit limit.
- When you MANAGE the responsibilities at your job while working in excellence you are awarded with a financial increase or a promotion.

THE PRINCIPLE OF MANAGEMENT

Management is one of the ancient principles God honors. Good management skills unlocks **GROWTH**, **INCREASE**, **PROSPERITY** and **MULTIPLICATION**. God proved this to us in the garden of Eden.

When the Lord created the earth and the sky He did not allow plants to grow and rain to fall because there was no one to manage the growth. When the Lord saw there wasn't anyone to manage what He created He took dust from the ground and formed man.

The purpose of man was to manage the creation of God. This is why God gave Adam dominion over the earth. He wanted him to rule over all creation and **MANAGE** the growth and multiplication that was to come.

Genesis 2:4-15 says, "This is the story of the creation of the sky and the earth. When the Lord God first made the earth and the sky, there were still no plants on the earth. Nothing was growing in the fields because the Lord God had not yet made it rain on the land.

And there was no person to care for the ground, but a mist would rise up from the earth and water all the ground. Then the Lord God took dust from the ground and formed a man from it. He breathed the breath of life into the man's nose, and the man became a living person.

Then the Lord God planted a garden in the east, in a place called Eden, and put the man he had formed into it. The Lord God caused every beautiful tree and every tree that was good for food to grow out of the ground. In the middle of the garden, God put the tree that gives life and also the tree that gives the knowledge of good and evil.

A river flowed through Eden and watered the garden. From there the river branched out to become four rivers. The first river, named Pishon, flows around the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold. The gold of that land is excellent. Bdellium and onyx are also found there.

The second river, named Gihon, flows around the whole land of Cush. The third river, named Tigris, flows out of Assyria toward the east. The fourth river is the Euphrates. The Lord God put the man in the garden of Eden to care for it and work it."

In the scripture above God did not allow anything to grow until He knew someone was **SKILLED** enough to manage the growth. This principle applies to your money. When God sees that you are a **SKILLED MANAGER** He will increase your money.

Money is attracted to management because it knows it will grow and not be wasted. It knows it will multiply and not be underutilized. It knows it will be preserved and not spent. Money is **NOT** attracted to work. It is attracted to **MANAGEMENT**.

Rather than trying to work harder, try developing your management skills. Learn how to distribute the money you have wisely. Start paying your bills on time. Do not live above your means. Do not make impulsive purchases. Invest strategically. Save continuously. Spend frugally.

As you begin to develop your management skills you won't have to chase money, money will chase you. Focus on management, **NOT** money! If you can manage small money God will reward you with big money.

Matthew 25:23 says, "The master answered, 'You did well. You are a good and loyal servant. Because you were loyal with small things, I will let you care for much greater things. Come and share my joy with me."
