KINGDOM FINANCIAL LAWS

Proverbs 11:24

Do you want to strengthen your finances? Do you want God to be involved with your finances? Do you want your finances to be blessed? Well, if the answer is yes then implement these Kingdom laws. Your finances are guaranteed to prosper.

THE PRINCIPLE OF GIVING: Proverbs 11:24 says, "Some people give much but get back even more." (NCV). Selfishness is the quickest way to be poor. Refusing to release the financial resources that God gave you PREVENTS Him from adding more to you.

People who have proven that money does not master them will be given more money to rule over. A giver will never go broke because he will always be replenished. THE PRINCIPLE OF TITHING: Malachi: 3:10-12 says,

"Bring to the storehouse a full tenth of what you earn so there will be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord All-Powerful. "I will open the windows of heaven for you and pour out all the blessings you need. I will stop the insects so they won't eat your crops. The grapes won't fall from your vines before they are ready to pick," says the Lord All-Powerful. "All the nations will call you blessed, because you will have a pleasant country," says the Lord All-Powerful."

Tithing protects your finances from unexpected circumstances. It is a way of honoring God with your money. People who do not tithe will have holes in their pockets, having **NOTHING** left over from what they earned. People who tithe will always have money left over. If you are foolish enough to rob God, He will allow someone bold enough to rob you.

PRINCIPLE OF INVESTING: Mathew 25:14-30 talks about the power of investing in this parable. Investing requires PATIENCE. It is playing the long game. Investing is

caring more about the future than the now. It is the best way to alleviate any financial worries in the near future. God blesses investors because they honor the cycle of **SEED**, **TIME** and **HARVEST**.

THE PRINCIPLE Of GENEROSITY: Proverbs 11:25 says, "Whoever gives to others will get richer; those who help others will themselves be helped." (NCV). Generous will be blessed. They will not go broke. The more you give away, the more you will get in return. God will not allow a giver to go without because seed will always be given to the sower.

THE PRINCIPLE OF SOWING: 2nd Corinthians 9:6 says, "Remember this: The person who plants a little will have a small harvest, but the person who plants a lot will have a big harvest." Sowing seed in good ground always

You always get back MORE than you sowed. The people who are guaranteed an abundant financial future sow

money into good ground, expecting a financial harvest later.

THE LAW OF LOVING MONEY: 1st Timothy 6:10 says, "The love of money causes all kinds of evil. Some people have left the faith, because they wanted to get more money, but they have caused themselves much sorrow." (NCV). Having a love for money will influence you to abandon your faith. Confusing the need for money with the love of money is dangerous toward your salvation.

If possible, you should save ten to fifteen percent of your income. As the scripture states, saving money consistently is what activates the power of growth.

THE PRINCIPLE OF PUTTING YOUR HOPE IN

WEALTH: 1st Timothy 6:17 says, "Command those who are rich with things of this world not to be proud. Tell them to hope in God, not in their uncertain riches. God richly gives us everything to enjoy." If you are putting your trust in wealth you will be greatly disappointed. Removing God from the center of your heart and replacing it with wealth will guarantee destruction.

THE PRINCIPLE OF THE DILIGENT: Proverbs 10:4 says, "He becometh poor that dealeth with a slack hand: But the hand of the diligent maketh rich." Consistency, hard work and great effort will make you rich. Being rich is not just having millions of dollars in the bank. Being rich is having MORE than enough left over. In the Kingdom, what is LEFT OVER after you've taken care of your needs defines how rich you are.

THE PRINCIPLE OF DEBT: Proverbs 22:7 says, "The rich rule over the poor, and borrowers are servants to lenders."

The borrower is a slave to the lender. Debt limits
