20 WAYS HOW PEOPLE ARE UNEQUALLY YOKED

2nd Corinthians 6:14, “Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?”

- People are unequally yoked by what they **VALUE**:
When people’s values are unequally yoked they will never agree on what is important and primary.
- People are unequally yoked by **WHAT** they believe:
When people believe in two different things their actions will not align with one another. For example, a person who believes in doing what is wrong will disagree with a person who does what is honest.
- People are unequally yoked by **WHO** they believe in:
People who believe in two different entities will never

see things the same way. For example, a muslim will not see God in the same way a Christian will.

- People are unequally yoked by their **WORK ETHIC**:
Lazy and hardworking people will never agree on the method in which to get things done.
- People are unequally yoked by their **PERCEPTION**:
When two people understand the same thing differently it will be impossible for them to unite.
- People are unequally yoked by their **VISION**: When two united people have a different vision it will be impossible for them to build anything together.
- People are unequally yoked by their **PERSPECTIVE**:
When two people see the same problem differently they will not agree on a common solution.
- People are unequally yoked by their **VIEWS**: This is applicable to business relationships. When business

partners have different views on how to govern the company, the spirit of dysfunction will progress.

- People are unequally yoked by their **MENTALITY**: An educated person and non-educated person think differently. A spiritual person and a non-believer think differently.
- People are unequally yoked by their **CULTURE**: A person who is engrossed with the Hip-Hop culture does not speak, think or behave in the same manner of a person who is consumed with the culture of higher learning and academics.
- People are unequally yoked by their **PASSION**: People who are unequally yoked by their passions will not agree to support their partner's endeavors. For example, a person who has a passion to build a business will have a hard time supporting an individual who is content with working a job.

- People are unequally yoked in how they **LOVE**: People who love unconditionally will become frustrated with people who love with conditions if they are joined in marriage. People who are unequally yoked in love will never be happy or content with one another.
- People are unequally yoke **FINANCIALLY**: You do not have to make dollar for dollar to be equally yoked. However, when a person cannot provide for the needs and wants of their partner to their standards they are financially unequally yoked.
- People are unequally yoked by their **DECISION MAKING ABILITY**: Wise people make great decisions. Foolish people make poor decisions. It is impossible for a wise person and a foolish person to agree because the content of their decisions will never align with one another.
- People are unequally yoked by how they **COMMUNICATE**: People who speak with specifics are

frustrated with people who speak in generalities. They will never see eye to eye.

- People are unequally yoked by their **PERSONALITY**: People who are homebodies are boring to people who are outgoing. Marrying someone who has a different personality than you will stifle the growth in the relationship.
- People are unequally yoked by their **STANDARDS**: People who practice excellence will never agree to the standards of mediocrity that a person abides by.
- People are unequally yoked by their **MORALITY**: When morally conscious people connect with individuals who are immoral they will never walk in agreement to achieve anything great.
- People are unequally yoked by **PRINCIPALITIES**: When people are ruled by two different set of rules they will never grow together because they live in two separate

world's. For example, a person who honors church by-laws will never receive the blessings of a person who honors the principles of the Kingdom of God.

- People are unequally yoked by their **SEXUAL TASTE AND APPETITE**: When you marry a person who is sexually conservative, when you are sexually adventurous you will become sexually frustrated. A married couple who are unequally yoked sexually will have more arguments than agreements regarding bedroom issues.

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
