Hello everyone, my name is Matt B, and I started my journey in recovery roughly five years ago. And in that time, I have been to inpatient multiple times, outpatient a couple times and had multiple relapses for many reasons. The biggest reason being I thought I could still be in control of everything and try to do it all on my own. Which I finally figured out is not a successful path in recovery.

This time I chose to stay in outpatient voluntarily for a place to be around likeminded people and hold myself accountable on a weekly basis in groups which I will be bridging from in a couple weeks. I attend meetings regularly and always keep my ears open to hear things to help benefit me in my journey. I'm in the process of getting a new sponsor right now and have found a guy who has what I'm looking for in my sobriety. I started college last September at 45 years old and absolutely love it, as I'm taking psychology to become a drug and alcohol counselor.

I grew up around addiction my whole life and unfortunately lost my dad to it at 52 years old. And I refuse to let addiction take me away from my 7-year-old son at such an early age. These days I try daily to lead by setting a good example for him. I start my day with the 3rd step prayer and repeat it multiple times throughout the day and do thy will not my own. That has been the biggest key in my sobriety now that I was lacking in the past.

I started typing this by giving the definition for recovery. The action or process of regaining something stolen or lost. My innocence and chances of not being an addict were stolen from me as a very young child and I now fight daily to regain that and to be the best human I can be to be of benefit to others. And to be as honest, openminded and willing as I can in every aspect of my day to day.

For each and every one of the millions of success stories in AA you will hear repeatedly about responsibility. It is our responsibility to stay involved in sobriety and follow our sponsor's suggestions. It is our responsibility to actively cultivate and grow willingness. It's important to grasp that you are not "powerless" completely: you do have the power to engage in a program of recovery, the power to choose not to abuse substances....but you are powerless over drugs and alcohol if you put them in your body.

Acceptance comes when we feel a profound sense of hope and peace in coming to terms with our addiction and recovery. We don't dread a future of meeting attendance, sponsor contact and step work; instead we begin to see recovery is a precious gift.

It has been my experience that doing the steps has brought me serenity and the welcome realization that AA is not just a program where sick people get well—it is a way of living that is rewarding in and of itself.

Lot's of people find that once they do Step One, that all manner of help appears! I feel grateful to have a program that expands as I grow. Having a firm foundation in recovery through steps has also given me a welcoming fellowship to accompany me in my journey.
