## A Short Memo *From Siouxland Intergroup Central Office*

**Hello!** This past month the phone continues to ring on average of 10-12 calls per week for available meetings within our District as well outside of our District. Last month Central Office had 32 drop in visitors: to *buy literature, meeting schedules, pamphlets and offer group donations*. The website got an average of 38 daily visits this past month ( 1,089 total) . Donations were received from 16 AA Groups, Unity Dinner, 22 Faithful Fiver's and two Birthdays! Thank you to those groups and individuals that continue supporting your Intergroup Central Office! Thank you to those who stop in every month, we do have continuous sales of our AA literature from our members including District 2 and Vermillion.

District 1 report for February, District 1 will be reimbursing committee chairs for the June Area Conference. All committee chairs have been filled for Oct. Area 24 Fall Conference.

Intergroup's next meeting 4/18/24, we did host our first Service Workshop Panel which went very well, with 16 attendees. We had great panel speakers that shared on our panel topics of service Siouxland Intergroup does. It was suggested we do the workshop a few times a year and adding members to bring a sponsee. Next Service Workshop Panel will be May 4, 2024, at one of the other Club Houses, at noon.

About nine-tenths of our oldest and best members could never have got by!

As we look back on it, rather comical. Imagine, if you can, one alcoholic judging another! *That is why we all judge the newcomer less and less. If alcohol is an uncontrollable problem to him and he wishes to do something about it, that is enough for us.*

*We do not wish to deny anyone his chance to recover from Alcoholism. We wish to be just as inclusive as we can, never exclusive.”*

## The Role of an Intergroup Representative

Serving as an Intergroup Representative offers you a rewarding opportunity to share in Alcoholics Anonymous' Third Legacy—Service.



Here's how it works. The Intergroup Representative is elected by his or her group. (Meetings, by definition, do not have group reps). They then attend the monthly Intergroup Representatives meeting. To this meeting they bring any suggestions, comments, or opinions their group may have. The Intergroup Representative or alternate casts their groups vote on all matters requiring a group conscience.

The purpose of the Intergroup Rep is to be a link in the chain connecting the individual member of an AA group to those who are elected to maintain the operation of Siouland Intergroup. This allows Siouland Intergroup to better serve its members—which is the reason for its existence as provided for in the 9th Tradition which says, "AA, as such ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve."

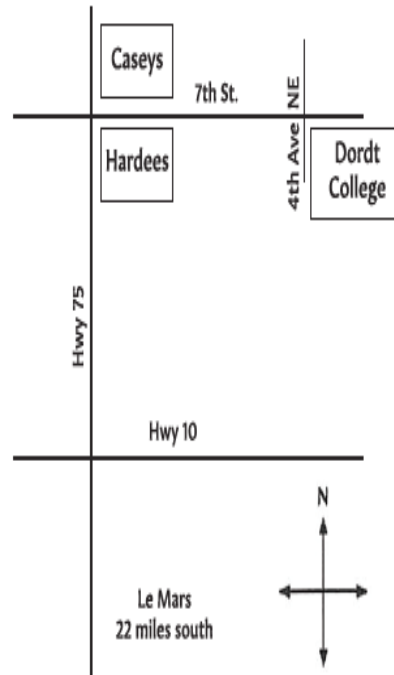

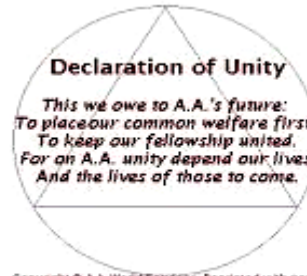
