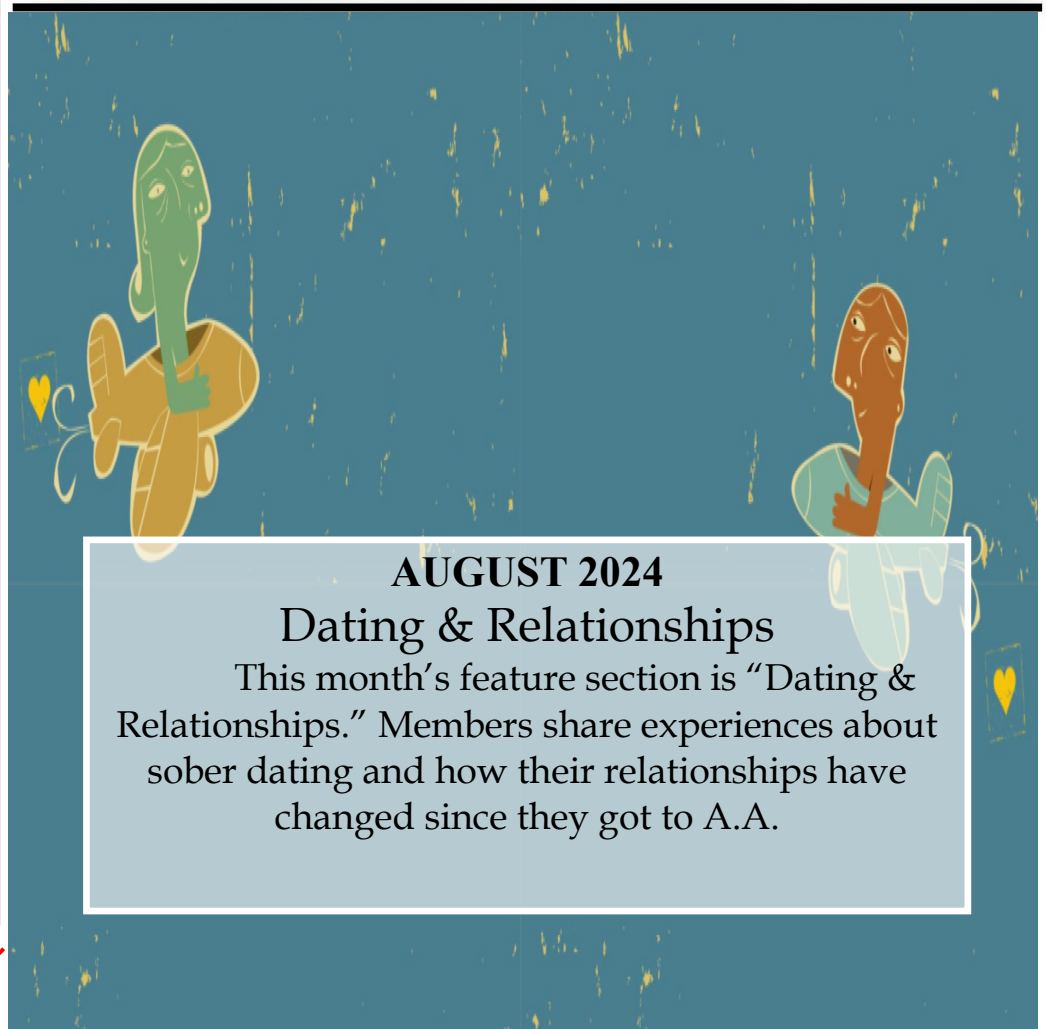

Tradition Eight *“Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.”*

“Neither could AA itself function without full-time workers. At the Foundation* and intergroup offices, we couldn’t employ non-alcoholics as secretaries; we had to have people who knew the AA pitch.”

“At the Foundation, the same story repeats itself. Eight tons of books and literature per month do not package and channel themselves all over the world. Sacks of letters on every conceivable AA problem...must be answered by people who *know*. Right contacts with the world outside have to be maintained. AA’s lifelines have to be tended. So we hire AA staff members. They are professional secretaries, but they certainly are not professional AA’s.”

“Our Twelfth Step is never paid for, but those who labor in service for us are worthy of their hire.”

The Role of an Intergroup Representative

Serving as an Intergroup Representative offers you a rewarding opportunity to share in Alcoholics Anonymous’ Third Legacy—Service.



Here’s how it works. The Intergroup Representative is elected by his or her group. (Meetings, by definition, do not have group reps). They then attend the monthly Intergroup Representatives meeting. To this meeting they bring any suggestions, comments, or opinions their group may have. The Intergroup Representative or alternate casts their groups vote on all matters requiring a group conscience.

The purpose of the Intergroup Rep is to be a link in the chain connecting the individual member of an AA group to those who are elected to maintain the operation of Siouland Intergroup. This allows Siouland Intergroup to better serve its members—which is the reason for its existence as provided for in the 9th Tradition which says, “AA, as such ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.”

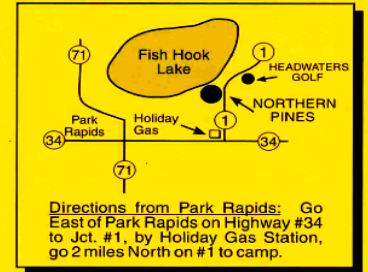

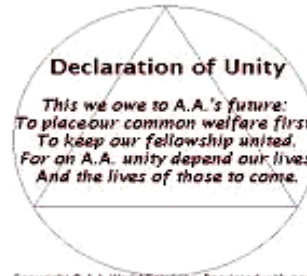
