Meet and greet new neighbors and introduce them to Meridian Hills.


Event Committee

Help plan subdivision social activities.


Caring Neighbors Committee

Why Can't I Park on the Street Overnight?

Because our neighborhood has no sidewalks, parking on the street creates a number of issues. Children walking to the bus, people walking their dogs, or exercising need to share the street with vehicles thus causing a safety concern. Public services such as mail, village maintenance, garbage trucks, snow plows, and emergency vehicles need access to the entire street.

Parking on the street should be temporary.

Covenants

- No animals except for dogs, cats, and other small household pets. Only 2 pets per household and there is a Village leash law.
- No habitual parking on the street (daytime or overnight). No campers, trailers of any kind, boats, business trucks, or motor homes parked overnight.
- No fences in front yard or within 25 feet of any side street.
- No signs posted at the entrance to the subdivision except one-day events (e.g., garage sales, open houses, etc.)
- All lots are residential. No sheds allowed.
