1994 PRIORITIES At the Planning Meeting held on Nov. 10th, three priorities for the Martin Drive Neighborhood were selected for next year. The first is an impact project directed towards upgrading the properties on Vliet Street from Highland to 46th Street.

The second will be written communications to unite and improve the neighborhood and will include publication of quarterly newsletters, an information packet for new residents to include block watch captains, calendar of monthly meetings and special events, and Neighborhood Guidelines.

The third is formation of a task force to get tough on graffiti that is creeping into this neighborhood.

Happy Holidays from NHS, COWSA and the Martin Drive Neighborhood -- Please have a safe and crime free Holiday by remembering these tips:

- Do not leave packages in your car.
   Keep them locked in the trunk.
- If you will be away for the Holidays, leave lights on a timer set to go on in the evenings. Leave a radio on to a talkshow. Alert a trusted neighbor or block watch captain to be on the watch. Ask a neighbor to park their car in your driveway. Arrange to have your walk shoveled so your house will not look deserted.

- When leaving your house don't take a lot of cash. Take only the credit card you will need and 2 or 3 checks. Carry this in a small pocket book carried on your person.
- · Be aware of what is going on



around you. Walk with confidence.

 Have your keys ready when you approach your home or when going to your car.

NHS MILWAUKEE - A two year contract exists between the Martin Drive Neighborhood and NHS Milwaukee. A pool of money has been set aside specifically for our neighborhood. In 1993, 12 residents received rebates and 3 residents completed paint projects. Plan now for your 1994 project. If you are considering

doing exterior painting, security or energy efficiency improvements to your property, please contact NHS Milwaukee. Couldn't you use a 50% rebate up to \$250 to make these improvements?

Loans & Grants - NHS offers purchase loans and assistance and home repair loans. If you're a renter and thinking about buying, inquire about NHS's home buyer seminars.

Rebate Program -- Are you thinking about: installing a fence, porch/step repairs, landscaping, grass planting, roof repairs, gutters, etc.? NHS may be able to help you with their rebate program.

Free Paint -- The NHS paint program offers free Sherwin Williams paint for exterior painting of your home. You can even select the colors. Painting your home can increase or decrease its value.

### Construction Advice --

NHS construction specialist, Tom White, offers advice on reputable contractors and methods of improving your property. He has many years of experience which comes free to you. Contact him now to plan your 1994 project. He may offer low cost suggestions you may not have considered.



### COWSA MOBILE WATCH PROGRAM

Cooperative West Side Association has a mobile watch program and is looking for volunteers. Being a volunteer requires approximately 4 hours per month (2 nights, 2 hour shifts). You can be a driver, rider, or based at home during that period. You can be paired with people in this neighborhood, so you will know the people you are with. GRAFFITI - Graffiti is more than an eyesore. Graffiti is a method of communication used by street gangs. They mark their territory and issue threats in code to other gangs with graffiti. By allowing graffiti to remain on your wall, you are passively supporting gang activity. Graffiti, when left on a wall, acts as an invitation to more graffiti. Please take it upon yourself to remove any graffiti on your property as soon as possible. The removal of graffiti identifies you as someone who takes pride in your property and as a good neighbor. You will be saying you care. If you are physically unable to remove graffiti yourself, please contact Frank Kopenski at 933-3066 for information and assistance.



### MARTIN DRIVE NEIGHBORHOOD GUIDE-LINES

This is our neighborhood. The quality of life in our neighborhood depends on mutual respect and concern.

- 1. Keeping your own property up will encourage your neighbors to do the same.
- 2. Graffiti, drugs and gangs cannot be tolerated in our neighborhood.
- 3. Noise is an intrusion. Please use common sense and be especially aware after 10:00 p.m.
- 4. Please refrain from using car horns in non-emergencies, and ask your guests and visitors to do the same.
- Remember the speed limit on residential streets is 25 MPH.
- 6. If your pet spends time outside, please be sure to clean up after it, whether in your yard or someone else's; dogs should be leashed, fenced or supervised.
- 7. Landlords who do not live in the area need to keep their property in a safe and presentable condition.
- 8. Children need to be supervised at all times to help them learn respect for adults, the law, and their property as well as the property of others.
- Remember this is your neighborhood and it is made up of people. Get to know your neighbors. Do your part to watch out for them, and they in turn will watch out for you.

TABS TO START -- Alderman Michael Murphy announced the city-wide Truancy new Abatement/Burglary Suppression (TABS) program which began Nov. 29. TABS hopes to reduce truancy, deter daytime burglary, and prevent at-risk youth from becoming involved in the juvenile justice system. TABS is a collaborative effort of the Milwaukee Police and Sheriff's Departments, Milwaukee Public Schools and Boys & Girls Club of Greater Milwaukee.

The TABS program empowers law enforcement officers to pick up truants and transport them to one of two TABS Centers. Parents will be called, they will be counseled, and follow-up measures will be planned. This new \$1 million state-funded program is one of three such programs in the nation.

If you will volunteer a meeting place we will distribute notices and conduct your first meeting.
