

NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP SCHEDULED

MARTIN DRIVE NEIGHBOR-HOOD CLEANUP--AUGUST 28

A n area wide cleanup day has been scheduled for Samuel scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 28th. This is a chance to spruce up our neighborhood. Cooperation West Side Association (COWSA) has made arrangements with the City of Milwaukee to have three large dumpsters placed on Juneau Avenue for residents. It's a perfect occasion to cleanup your yard, garage or basement of all the junk that accumulates. It's also a wonderful opportunity to help your neighbor get rid of the stuff that has been sitting behind his garage for the last two years.

We need volunteers to meet at 9:00 a.m. at 44th and Juneau to arm themselves with gloves, brooms, rakes, wheel barrows, and trash bags. COWSA has donated trash bags. Neighborhood Housing Services - Milwaukee (NHS) will provide a truck to carry large heavy objects to the dumpsters. A dolly is also available. We encourage everyone to participate, including youth. We can use their helping hands for the betterment of the neighborhood.

A clean, cared for neighborhood can help prevent crime because it shows that we care and are taking time to watch over our property.

If you have a large item and need help or use of the dolly or truck, or if you need assistance because of health, strength or disability, please contact a block watch captain who will communicate with the cleanup committee to get the help you need. Don't be afraid to ask . . . we want to help those who need it.

Those with little time can participate by cleaning their own yards; those with more time and energy might extend their efforts to help others who could use a hand.
