Quality of Life Ordinances


As you know, our new Police Captain, Arthur Jones has placed emphasis on enforcing quality of life ordinances. One issue subject to fine is pet care. Fines can be issued for violations such as:

Pet Issues — Animal at Large, Animal Litter Nuisance and Animal Disturbing the Peace. — All carry a \$111.10 fine.

Noise Issues — Excessive Noise, Loud Car Stereo, Unnecessary Vehicle Noise and Fireworks. These carry fines up to \$209.

Other issues for which fines can be issued include littering and sidewalks not kept clean of mud, dirt, snow, ice or any other foreign material.

Landlord Compact Local landlords have organized a landlord compact designed to share information to help landlords better manage their properties, offer support and information about screening tenants to avoid future problems. The next meeting will be held at Washington Park Senior Center at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 18th. Martin Drive Neighborhood Guidelines

This is our neighborhood. The quality of life in our neighborhood depends on mutual respect and concern.

Martin Drive Neighborhood Wel-

- Keeping your own property up will encourage your neighbors to do the same.
- Graffiti, drugs and gangs cannot be tolerated in our neighborhood.
- Noise is an intrusion. Please use common sense and be especially aware after 10 p.m.
 - 4 Please refrain from using car horns in non-emergencies, and ask your guest to do the same.
 - 5 Remember the speed limit on residential streets is 25 MPH.
 - 6 If your pet spends time outside, please be sure to clean up after it, whether in your yard or someone else's; dogs should be leashed, fenced or supervised.
 - Landlords who do not live in the area need to keep their property in a safe and presentable condition.
- Children need to be supervised at all times to help them learn respect for adults, the law, and their property as well as the property of others.
- Remember this is your neighborhood and it is made up of people. Get to know your neighbors. Do your part to watch out for them and they in turn will watch out for you.

Watch The Speed Limit - Please do not exceed the speed limit on Martin Drive, Highland Boulevard and 45th Streets. Too many people travel at too high a speed. You can expect the Police Department to be monitoring the speed limit on these streets this fall.
