- The Gospels record \_\_\_\_\_ people being filled with the Holy Spirit. Luke 1: 41, 67, 2:15-17, 4:1
- John the Baptist Luke 2:15-17
- \_\_\_\_\_ Luke 1:41
- Zechariah Luke 1:67
- \_\_\_\_\_ Luke 4:1
- The Holy Spirit was \_\_\_\_\_ in the conception of Jesus. Matthew 1:20, Luke 1:35

The Holy Spirit not only filled Jesus but He also:
