

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus:

Gray Memorial's Annual Stewardship program "What Shall We Bring", is well underway. It helps reinforce the fact that our Creator provides all we need for an abundant life. It also challenges us to give back to God's work in ways that guarantees that our church also has an abundant life. After all, everything we have, every spiritual gift we possess, our very life - It all belongs to God. In your alone time with the Lord, pick up your Bible and ponder the truth of Acts 17: 22 to 25:

²² Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, 'Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. ²³ For as I went through the city and

looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, "To an unknown god." What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you.

²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals, life and breath and all things.

Brothers and Sisters, Stewardship is not only about money, but its many facets include the sharing of our faith.

This is precisely what Paul is engaged in with the Athenians. Paul noted their many idols as he toured their great city. However, he calls attention to one particular worship space dedicated to an "unknown god". The Athenians are scrupulous in not wanting to offend their deities by leaving any divinity unacknowledged. Paul seizes the opportunity to introduce them to the God made known in Jesus Christ. The One True God. This God, once unknown, has now been revealed!'

In 1 Corinthians, Paul writes that we are "stewards of the mysteries of God".

As believers we strive to fully know the nature of our God and the love that God has for all of creation. It's a love that is more powerful even than death itself. We are called to share this story. We are stewards of the Gospel and as such we do not hoard this good news, but we offer it others. Paul was radically devoted to God and to his mission of telling the world of God's loving intentions toward creation. Paul's priority was to love and serve our One True God - who could not be contained in any idol of wood, stone, silver, or gold. When you know this to be true, it puts everything else in its proper place.

As we reflect on what it means to be a steward, we're invited to re-assess our priorities and to think about how well we've been able to share our own faith stories as they pertain to God's provision. Ponder what Jesus says in Luke 6:38- "Give, and you will receive. Your gift will return to you in full - pressed down, shaken together to make room for more, running over, and poured into your lap". How are you practicing this kind of stewardship? To whom can you tell about your personal experiences of God's love and provision?

You'll soon be receiving a Pledge Card, Spiritual Gift Survey, and other aids to help you determine what you would like to give towards Gray's 2025 operating budget. You'll also have an opportunity to get caught up on your 2024 pledge. You can even make a gift to further support the balance of our 2024 budget.

We've designated Sunday, November 17 as "Commitment Sunday". Please come to Gray Memorial's 10:00 am worship service and bring a friend. We'll present our pledge cards, prayers, gifts, and more. There's much to be thankful for as we support God's work in the world through Gray Memorial UMC. Afterwards, everyone is invited downstairs for a potluck luncheon in the fellowship hall.

"<u>Growing in Faith" Capital Campaign Account</u>: Balance reported in last month's Newsletter was \$39,058.77. Since then, we received interest of \$1.77. We did not pay any expenses, so our balance as of October 28th is \$39,060.54 (of that amount, the "furnace replacement donation funds" that remain are \$5,424.27).



Church Council Minutes October 16, 2024

Members present: Roy Alden (chair), Bobbi Pelletier, Diane Fitzpatrick, Cheryl Martin, Melonie Carlson, Debbie Barnes, David DeMerchant, Shirley Bowman

The meeting was opened at 1:00pm by Roy Alden, who offered an opening prayer.

Discussion Question: Roy proposed the following question for group discussion: "The pastor's recent sermons have emphasized that we establish more of a presence in our community, attempting to reach out to the unchurched and bring those people to God. As we move towards celebrating the birth of Christ, are there initiatives we can take as a church, not just as individuals, to invite people to God's table?" The following suggestions were raised about past practices as well as new ideas.

- Radio Announcements
- Living Nativity Scene
- Christmas tree sales with information cards about Gray Memorial that can be given to anyone purchasing a tree.
- Craft Fair Cookie Booth with pocket prayer shawls being given to all who purchase cookies.
- Cheryl's Stewardship Moment on October 20th will address the desire for people to come back to church.
- Bobbi suggested that we put something in the Food Pantry boxes to let clients know that several area churches helped to establish the pantry. Will include a note that as the food they receive will feed their bodies, attending church will feed their souls.
- Our new church sign could have messages inviting people to join us for worship.
- Melonie mentioned an Advent Festival that will be held here at Gray Memorial on December 7th. Plans are being made to have families participate in making decorations to take home and will provide activities for the children.
- The Harvest Supper will be held on November 9th.
- Roy mentioned The Aroostook Common that highlights events going on via Facebook. He stated the need for our church membership to get excited about promoting church events and volunteer to participate. Bobbi also pointed out that many people won't volunteer, but if asked personally, they are often times willing to help with events.

Financial Reports:

- Shirley Bowman addressed her report that is provided later in the Newsletter.
- Bobbi reported that a person had gifted us with \$10,000.00 to be used towards paying four months of Mission Shares that are overdue. That will leave us just two months behind as of the end of September.
- There is still money sitting in special funds for church use Bobbi will work with Trustees to give them funds donated for various projects they are managing.
- We are on track with expenses. All bills are paid with the exception of the Mission Shares that are still due.
- Bobbi distributed the budget sheet that has reports of the 2021 through 2024 budgets. She asked for committees to set their budgets for 2025 and have them in to her by November 20th.
- All committee chairs need to report who is on each committee and submit their lists to Bobbi, noting that the people serving on committees will serve through 2025. Bobbi will need to have this information so the

Nominations Committee can fill critical vacancies and create the Leadership Report before the Church Conference which will be held with other churches in our Cluster at Grant Memorial on December 21st.

Other reports:

- Dave Demerchant reported that the Trustees upgraded the switches in the Sanctuary to avoid going into the circuit box to turn on certain lights. The new church digital sign will soon be installed. The Trustees will also be paying for new faucets in the downstairs bathrooms.
- Cheryl reported on the status of the Stewardship Letter that will soon be sent to all church members. Once it is approved by Pastor Rich, the letter will be mailed out. Roy asked if a Time and Talents sheet will be included. There are no plans to include one this at this time, but Bobbi will research to see if we an adapt one we've used in the past.
- Roy mentioned that Pastor Rich has informed him that the mandatory retirement age for pastors is at the age of seventy-two. Pastor Rich will reach this milestone in May and doesn't know at this time if he will be allowed to stay on at Gray Memorial after his birthday. Roy suggested that a letter be sent to the Bishop requesting that Pastor Rich should be allowed to stay with us beyond May.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, November 21, at 1:00pm.
