



Church Council Minutes May 22, 2025

Members Present: Roy Alden (chair), Pastor Rich Rego, Bobbi Pelletier, Diane Fitzpatrick, Cheryl Martin, Debbie Barnes, Judi Greenier, Shirley Bowman

The meeting was opened by chair, Roy Alden, at 1:00pm. Pastor Rich offered an opening prayer.

Open Discussion Question: What can we do as Council members to help our new pastor before he arrives on July 1st? Roy suggested that we could write a report on our personal gifts that would be of help to Pastor Ben. He also suggested that we create a video of a gathering of chair persons of the various committees in the church. The people participating could wear their name badges so that Pastor Ben could put faces with names as we talk about our church and the important things we would like to have him know before arriving in Caribou. This would enable him to have contact people in place should he have questions. Roy asked Debbie to ask the Transition Team if this is something that we could do. Bobbi offered to call Pastor Ben to ask him what he would like to see from us that would help him as he begins his ministry with us.

Financial Statements:

• Shirley reported that the total amount of funds received in the month of April was \$17,542.88.

• Bobbi reported on where the church is financially. We are not receiving enough contributions each month to cover our expenses and may be nearly \$8,000.00 behind by the end of May. She suggested that she could use some of the \$15,225.35 that was paid ahead for the 2025 operating budget to meet expenses. Our ending balance in the checkbook in April was negative \$1,078.20. Bobbi will be talking with Dead River Oil Company next week to get us put on a contract for monthly fuel expenses. Only two months of our Mission Shares have been paid thus far this year, so we are two months behind. These issues will be approached from a stewardship perspective from the pulpit.

Security Team:

Pastor Rich mentioned that we have been asking for a monthly report from the Security Team for three months and have not received any information. He suggested that a representative report to the Church Council every month. Roy will ask Colleen Harmon to be at next month's meeting to report on the Safer Sanctuary and Red Cross trainings that need to be held, as the Security Team is responsible for scheduling the trainings. Roy suggested that the ushers be included in the training.

Transition Process:

Debbie Barnes will schedule a meeting of one member from each of the subcommittees to assess where we are in the transition process. The meeting will be held on May 28th with a time to be determined.

Other Business:

Bobbi reported that she has talked with a representative from the Andover Organ Company. The company does not recommend putting our organ "to sleep". It was suggested that someone come in about one hour a week to play the organ and make sure they "push the pedals" to keep the organ functioning. Judi suggested setting up a schedule for volunteers who would like to help out. Debbie suggested that we get from the company a list of things to do as well as not to do to the organ.

The next meeting will be held on Thursday, June 19th, at 1:00pm.
