It's that empty space, the space that can be filled with hot coffee (or tea!) that he's really after. So too it is in the life of faith. It is precisely our encounter with emptiness that reveals our great need for God, and the hope that God is here, now. The One who gave you life waits with patient expectation, in every moment of every day, for you to turn your heart to Christ Jesus to fill that longing for the deeper love, love that enters our scene with the gentleness and humility of a newborn babe.

The season of Advent beckons us to hope beyond hope – in the darkest days of the year – that the dawn of a New Day is certain to come. Where else can we encounter the self-emptying love of Christ, the steadfast trust in an ever-present God, but in the empty spaces, in the darkest of nights? How else are we to be filled to the measure of the fullness of God, filled even to overflowing, unless by trusting that the emptiness itself offers the promise and potential to contain such an abundance of joy?

As followers of Christ, the trust we have come to know in him and seek to grow in him, our encounter with God's self-emptying love is all we need to hold one another's joys, our sorrows, our fullness and our emptiness, and through every season the faithfulness of God shines forth with the awesome splendor of the Son. Your faithful contributions – your time, your offerings and tithes, your talents and treasures, your outpouring of love, your commitment to serve on committees, boards, and trustees, to gather in small groups, to serve your neighbors in Christ's love and grace, to sing and offer your hearts in worship and praise, to pray together in silence, to wait on the Lord, to bear one another's burdens – all of it proclaims the fullness of hope we share in God's abundant grace, hope even and perhaps especially in the midst of emptiness. Faith itself is a gift, as is our life together in Christ. Thank you GMUMC for your willingness to walk the road of faith. May you be blessed in this Advent season, and may your cup overflow!

Gray Memorial has an immediate opening for a Financial Secretary. Shirley Bowman has expressed her desire to step down from this position and move on to other plans. Shirley has done a wonderful job over the last three plus years as well as during a previous tenure. She will be greatly missed in this position.

The Financial Secretary position oversees the tracking and reporting of financial gifts to Gray Memorial. It requires weekly deposit reports, a monthly report to the Church Council, two reports annually to donors, and tracking the results of the annual stewardship campaign, all using a computerized software program. Training assistance would be provided. The position also requires a general knowledge of bookkeeping, a detail-oriented work standard as well as an ability to maintain very strict privacy about individual donors and their accounts. Church Council Minutes November 20, 2025

Members Present: Pastor Ben Daggett, Judi Greenier, Diane Fitzpatrick, Bobbi Pelletier, Debbie Barnes, Richard Clark, Cheryl Martin, Melonie Carlson

The meeting was opened by Judi, who was filling in for Roy Alden.

Pastor Ben offered a lovely opening prayer.

Open Discussion Question: Cheryl shared Roy's suggestion on how we can apply the "puzzle" that Cheryl recently preached about to our own experiences at Gray Memorial. Key points from the discussion were: Our puzzle is not complete, God is at the center of our puzzle, encouraging the men of Gray to connect with God on a deeper level, and resting in God is where we have our strength.

The minutes from the October meeting were accepted.

Celebrations:

Congratulations to Pastor Ben on being accepted for ordination as an elder by The Board of Ordained Ministry!! The Harvest Supper was a great event that was well attended and received many compliments. The church's response to the Cookie Booth at the Arts and Crafts festival was wonderful. Many people stepped up to the plate to provide cookies! Our Cluster gathering in Houlton was well represented by nine churches! This event made the headlines in The UM Catalyst weekly newsletter! Our NOW committee is working on decorations for our Cluster tree at the St. Appolonia "Festival of Trees" event to be held in Presque Isle. The theme of our tree is "Fruits of the Spirit".

Committee Reports:

Bobbi presented the financial reports. The monthly financial report for October shows a deficit of \$5,764.69 in Operating Budget funds. However, there is money in the 'Special Funds for Church Use" that can be used to offset

some of the deficit and will probably be used in November. If not for the many "Special Funds" accounts that are held in the checking account, we'd unfortunately not have enough money in the checkbook to pay our bills.

Bobbi gave everyone the proposed 2026 budget spreadsheet and noted that the Worker's Comp figure will not be known until May or June and the Pastor Pension Benefit has not been calculated yet, so this proposed budget may change. These two amounts are not something our church can change, so it should not prevent us from approving the proposed budget. Also, the Mission Shares are now reduced from three separate lines in the budget to just one line. The group went through the budget lines for the various Programs - Most committees stayed the same as last year in their budget proposals. The Trustees have had to increase many of their lines. Mission Shares have been reduced for 2026. As of the end of October, we are seven months behind in paying our Mission Shares. Bobbi asked Judi if the Trustees have discussed withdrawing money from one of the permanent funds and she said she did not think they had as yet. The request for funds from the Permanent Fund would need to be made to the Trustees and the decision to do so would need to be officially approved by the Board of Trustees. (Note: This was brought up during the Trustees' October meeting.)

For SPRC, after some discussion, Debbie suggested leaving the Church Office Administrator's salary at \$10,000 instead of the proposed \$11,000; also, the Treasurer's compensation be increased to \$3,000 instead of the \$2,000 that was proposed. These changes offset each other. The proposed 2026 budget, with these changes, totaled \$230,347.20. Melonie moved to accept the amended budget (no change to the original bottom line) and any unforeseen changes that may occur. Debbie seconded the motion and all were in favor. This proposed budget will be presented to the congregation on Sunday, December 7th for discussion and a vote.

Nominations:

There are several committees in need of new members. Discussion was held on how to fill these positions so that we can meet after the worship service on November 30th to prepare a final list to present to the Charge Conference being held on December 7th.

New Business: Judi shared a report from Jud about a gentleman named Leonard Clyburn who owns property on the Strickland Road that he may wish to donate to our church. There is a potential buyer for the property, but should that fall through, he would like to donate the property to our church. Further research will be done on this proposal.

Pastor Ben offered another lovely prayer as a closing to our meeting.

We will next meet on November 30th to vote on the Nominations Committee report, with our next regularly scheduled meeting to be held on Thursday, December 18th at 1:00.

Church Council Minutes November 30, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 11:30am by Judi Greenier, who was filling in for Chair, Roy Alden. Pastor Ben then offered a lovely opening prayer.

This special meeting was called to discuss and vote on the report of the Committee on Nominations. Bobbi reported that Debbie Nichols is willing to continue as an Alternate Lay Member to Annual Conference. Pam Thompson has agreed to serve on the SPRC. Openings remain for a position on the audit committee, and chairperson of the SPRC.

Pastor Ben reported that he will be discussing the SPRC chair position with a possible candidate this week and is in hopes of having the position filled by December 7th.

Bobbi said she will wait until Friday to publish the report in case some of the vacant positions are filled.

Melonie moved that we accept the proposed slate of committee members that we have thus far and accept any additions that may be made from the floor at the worship service on December 7th. Bobbi asked that Pastor Ben present and explain this report before the vote is taken by the congregation on December 7th.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:50am.
