Home and away must be the same. Max 25 players (40 in October). Must have rated sub at every position. Players must have played at least 6 games at a listed position in order to start UNLESS he is rated fielding 1 or 2. They may play that position after the 6th inning. Players may NOT play a position not listed on their card unless injury with no rated sub available. If a DH did not play the field in MLB then he may NOT play the field in AABA.	A minimum <u>5-man</u> continuous rotation must be used per home/away series. A starter may relieve if he is not starting in the series. (counts as a GP) Must be removed if they give up 7 runs.
