- Referrals for housing, medical care and counseling
- Parenting support or adoption information
- There is no charge for these services and they do not discriminate because of race, color, national origin, age, marital status, or religious affiliation of their clients.

In addition to this, two-hundred and fifty dollars has been given to a local family that is experiencing financial need. It is through the generosity and hard work of our members that we are able to lighten the financial burden that others are carrying. A mission of the HWC is to

So, please be sure to come. We are planning a fun evening. If anyone would like to help, please contact Ann Leo at leoann1280@gmail.com or 330-304-5988.


