Recipe for the Month:



Apple Cake

2 eggs

³⁄₄ vegetable oil

1 cup white sugar

1 cup brown sugar

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 cups flour

2 teaspoons baking soda

4 cups diced apples

1 cup chopped nuts

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a bundt pan. Beat together the eggs, oil, brown and white sugars, cinnamon, salt and vanilla. Add flour and baking soda to the mixture. Fold in apples and nuts. Bake in a preheated oven until a fork inserted into the cake comes out clean, about one hour.
