The Scholarship committee will soon be busy reading those scholarship submissions. Good Luck to all!



#### **FUNDRAISING UPDATE:**

2025 has the potential to create a more organized fundraising agenda which could generate funds for community activities for

years to come.

The following are the 2025 fundraising activities, along with estimates of the funds they have/may generate. Keep in mind, these activities do NOT include funds raised from membership donations/dues or the miscellaneous projects that seem to come up each year.

Super Bowl Football Squares - \$500 Easter Egg Hunt - \$1,500 Online Auction associated with the Easter Egg Hunt - \$1,000 Wing Ding - \$4,000 TOTAL - \$7,000

If we are actually able to raise \$7,000 on an annual basis with just these four activities, we should start to plan how best to invest the money, as well as plan on how to use the money for the benefit of the community.

In order to make the online auction a success we will need at least 5 large ticket items to sell. We also need to do a good job marketing this event to get the most bids. If you have any big ticket items to donate, or are aware of any businesses that would like to donate to the auction, please let me know. We will be creating the online auction within the next week.

## Recipe for the Month:

#### **Punch Bowl Cake**

One Cake mix (yellow or white)

2 lg Cool Whips

2 lg frozen strawberries w/sugar

1 lg strawberry jello

2 cans evaporated milk

Bake cake as directed.

Mix the strawberries, 2 cans of evaporated milk, jello (DO NOT ADD WATER TO THE JELLO AS THE PACKAGE STATES - JUST THE CONTENTS). Put the mixture in the refrigerator.

Cool the cake for about 1 hour.
Line punch bowl w/ Cool Whip.
Slice or crumble cake.
Start w/Cool Whip at bottom, then add strawberry mixture, then add cake on top of that.

Alternating Cool Whip, strawberry mixture and cake until everything is gone.

Garnish w/fresh cut strawberries.
