# **Butternut Squash Soup Recipe**

Ingredients:

2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

1 large yellow onion, chopped

½ teaspoon sea salt

1 (3-pound) butternut squash, peeled, seeded, and cubed

3 garlic cloves, chopped

1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage

½ tablespoon minced fresh rosemary

1 teaspoon grated fresh ginger

3 to 4 cups vegetable broth

Freshly ground black pepper to taste

Chopped parsley

Toasted pepitas

Crusty bread

#### Instructions:

Heat the oil in a large pot over medium heat.

Add the onion, salt, and several grinds of fresh pepper and sauté until soft, 5 to 8 minutes.

Add the squash and cook until it begins to soften, stirring occasionally, for 8 to 10 minutes.

Add the garlic, sage, rosemary, and ginger. Stir and cook for 30 seconds to 1 minute, until fragrant, then add 3 cups of the broth.

Bring to a boil, cover, and reduce heat to a simmer.

Cook until the squash is tender, 20 to 30 minutes.

Let cool slightly and pour the soup into a blender, working in batches if necessary, and blend until smooth.

If your soup is too thick, add up to 1 cup more broth and blend.

**S**eason to taste and serve with parsley, pepitas, and crusty bread.

#### Pumpkin Cake:

1 - 15oz can pumpkin1 angel food cake mix2/3 c H201/2 tsp cinnamon, 1/4 tsp ginger1/8 tsp cloves, 1/4 tsp nutmeg.

Mix all ingredients together. Put in a 11 3/4 x 7 1/2 glass dish. DO NOT GREASE

Bake at 350 for 25-30 minutes until toothpick comes out clean.

Serve with lots of whipped cream.
