### From the Pastor's Desk

Over the last few years we have discovered our local state park, Fort Ridgely. We have always been outdoors people and over the 19 years we have lived here we have certainly been there a number of times, hiked there on occasion, even camped there when our kids were small. But, over the last three years or so it has become our favorite close place of refuge.

Most weeks now we are there at least once. We snowshoe in the winter and hike many miles on the trails in the park in the other seasons. These days as the sun stays out longer we often, after a day of work, will head up to Fort Ridgely for an evening hike. That time of the day is a wonderful time to go, the wildlife is active, and we see countless different kinds of birds, racoons, squirrels; last week we even saw a skunk much to our chagrin. One of the things that we most look forward to seeing is the deer.

Having hiked there so often, we are aware that we are seeing the same groups of deer over and over again and they, like us, have patterns. Over the last year we have been watching a group of five, two does and three fawns. We would see them in about the same place at the

same time when we go. It has been fun to watch the fawns grow from being these tiny little things that weren't even as tall as the grass to almost the same size as their mothers. But now, after about a year, we no longer see the five of them together. It is probably time for the young ones to move on and start a new phase of their life as they go out on their own. For us, with our youngest graduating from high school this month, we see the same things happening in our own family. Both of our children are learning to navigate the world they live in in new ways with not quite so much support from mom and dad. As they leave our little nest it is difficult sometimes when we see the mistakes that they are about to make and as a parent, powerless to do anything about it. It seems all you can do is wait, be ready to help when you can, and wonder how everything will go.

A few weeks ago in church we read from Acts 1 about Jesus' ascension. I wonder what was going through Jesus' mind on those days leading up to that moment. He was leaving, not the fledgling disciples. They were the ones, like our young adults, that would need to navigate the world without him. Was he worried about the wrong decisions they would make? Did he wonder how far off track they would get before they would seek help? Did he wonder and worry about all of those that would come after them and believe in him? The hard fact is that we can't answer that. We don't know what he was thinking but we can know what he promised. In Acts 1 Jesus promised that they would receive power from the Holy Spirit. In Matthew 28 the very last thing Jesus says is, "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

This gives me hope for my children and all of the young people in this world that each year start a new chapter in life and head out on their own. They, like all of us, are not really alone. Christ is with them and us. Giving all of us power through the Holy Spirit, walking with us always. To the end of the age. God's Peace, Pr. Lowell
