Purple, the color of repentance covers the altar on this night and through the rest of Lent ending in late March.

From the Pastor's Desk

Each year I am asked to give a report for the year for the annual meetings at St. John's and St. Luke's. What follows is a reprint of that report for wider distribution.

In December of 2023 my wife and I took a quick trip to southern Utah to see some of the National Parks that fill that area of the country. We flew into Las Vegas and after a long day of travel our first park was Zion National Park.

Our plan for each park that we visited was going to be to take the scenic drive that is always available, take lots of pictures, and for us one of the most important things, take a hike. On that first day in Zion, even after a grueling day of travel, we decided to take two hikes. The first one was along the Virgin River

that has cut deep into the rocks to create the canyon in the park. The second one was a little more challenging. We decided we wanted to climb up a bit to see all of the rock formations from a different perspective. We hiked up! It wasn't very steep but every step we took we gained in elevation until after a mile and a half up we arrived at the scenic overlook some 600 feet above where we started where we could look out over the valley floor as the sun began to sink lower in the western sky. The other thing that we could see was the trail that we had just ascended and all of the layers of rock that we had climbed through. From that perspective it was much easier to see the different colors and types of rock and soil that made up the trail that we had just hiked. All different, challenging and beautiful in their own way. It gave us a new perspective and an opportunity to learn more about what we had iust done.

The turn of the year is also a time to look back to see what we have been through and get a new perspective and learn new things about what God is doing in the middle of us. Also, 2024 will mark my tenth year as your pastor and my tenth ordination anniversary so I have been thinking about all that we have been through together. Each year, each day is beautiful and challenging in its own way too. Just like this year.

This past year has been good to us. We continue to gather around the Word and Sacraments in our three member Churches and support one another through all kinds of live events, good and bad. We learn and teach, work and play, laugh and cry in many ways. One of the new things we are trying in our parish is happening outside of the church. St. Luke's has been hosting a time of devotions at the bar in downtown Franklin. Devos at the Depot, as it is called, has had about a dozen people gather each month to sing, pray, and look into the Bible for a little while. At this

point it is mostly regular worshipers that have attended but with hope it will grow.

Although not true in every church, in our parish giving in general has rebounded this year surpassing what was given last year which is great news! There is a downside to it though. And that is that though giving is up it still falls short of the expenses and after several years of running well behind the financial resources are running thin. We need to find a solution to be able to continue to serve God in the churches we know and love.

It has taken us almost three full years from the upheaval of the pandemic to return to the giving that we had seen before, but what is still lagging behind even the monetary giving is the participation. I have talked with many other pastors about this and it seems to be everywhere. We need to also find a solution for this because without people participating our church will close even if there is enough money.

Thankfully almost everyone in our parish continues to be healthy. 2023 was a quiet year for pastoral acts. Throughout our parish we had only four funerals and one burial. We will miss those that have gone on. But we do recognize that God's Church continues to grow and change. This year we also celebrated two baptisms and one confirmation bringing new life to us all.

I am grateful to be able to continue to serve as your pastor. Thank you for your prayers and encouragement. Most of all thank you for all you do both in the Church and out. Without you and all you do for the Kingdom of God we would be so much less than we are.

Online Giving Available at All Three Churches

We now have accounts set up so that everyone can give their offering online if they would like to. Each church has an account set up with an organization called Tithe.ly. This company helps to make sure that your giving is secure and recordable. There is a small fee for this service, 30 cents for each transaction and 1% for checking account withdrawals and 2.3% for credit cards. You can choose to pay these costs or have them taken out of the amount given, it is your choice.

In order to give to your congregation either click on the name to the right or scan the QR code next to it with your phone. Either will take you directly to the giving page for your church. The first time you do this you will need to set up an account with Tithe.ly (this way we will be able to include your giving in your giving statements). The next time you return, Tithe.ly will have your info and giving will be super simple.

My family has used Tithe.ly to give to other organizations and have found it simple and fast to use.
