From the Pastor's Desk

Each year I am asked by the Lutheran Churches to submit a pastor's report for their yearly annual meeting. What follows here is a reprinting of that report for wider distribution in our parish.

This year marks my tenth year here as your pastor and also ten years of the three churches working together. I continue to be grateful and filled with gratitude that I have the opportunity to serve alongside each of you in our work together in the Kingdom of God.

From the Pastor's Desk Continued

There is much to look back on and remember. We have had many joyous occasions celebrated; births and baptisms, confirmations, weddings, and milestone birthdays. We have also stood together and supported those in grief at the loss of many loved ones in our parish. Ten years is not that long of a period of time but it is long enough to experience many emotions filled with both joy and grief. This year we have had 2 Baptisms, 4 Confirmations and sadly, 13 funerals and burials.

We could spend much time remembering and calling to mind all of the things that have happened. There is a time and a place for that. But maybe my time in this report would be better spent looking ahead. What does the future hold? That is a big question! It might be easier and safer to start with where we are now.

There is much to celebrate. Our congregations are still vibrant places of community and caring. The communities we have built are strong and are willing to help each other and support one another in difficult times and celebrate with each other too. The three communities are willing to join each other on special occasions too. One of my favorite memories from this year is the picnic we had at the Ramsey Park in Redwood Falls. We had a large turnout for the worship and picnic. It was indeed a celebration. When we look to the future we know that these communities, the Body of Christ will continue to be strong and cared for. Thank you to all of you who continue to work in so many ways caring for each other and the Church throughout the world.

There are also things that we need to be aware of as we look to the future. In all three churches we are struggling for two things; people and money. As you come to church I know you are aware that there are just not as

many as there used to be in the pews. The sanctuary may seem mostly empty. And though it may not be as obvious, giving is just not keeping up with what it costs to operate the churches and finances are being stretched. When we look to the future, right now, it seems a little dark for our three churches in the form we have always known them. We will need to work for change in membership and giving as we head to the future.

On the monetary side I have done what I can. For 2024 I only received a small raise and in 2025 I will not receive any raise. The only change in my compensation for next year will be the change in health insurance. That means that I am receiving 84% of what is set as the minimum salary compensation by the Southwestern Minnesota Synod of the ELCA. I have been given extra weeks of vacation to help make up the difference but there is only so much time you can give me.

I can give powerful uplifting sermons but if no one is there to hear them what good are they? We can have different programs for people but if no one comes why go through the effort? The only way people are going to come into our churches is if we are willing to go out and bring them in. It takes more than asking someone to come. It takes being willing to go to their house and pick them up and actually bring them. Why? It is intimidating to walk into a place you don't know and feel comfortable. When was the last time you did something that bold? If we want more people we are the only ones that can make that happen. We have to be the ones to help others see that our doors are open and they are truly welcome.

What does the future hold? That is partly up to us and what you are willing to do for your church and the Kingdom of God. Are you willing to boldly invite your neighbors to be part of your church? Are you willing to take the first step, go the extra mile? If so, then we will continue to grow and thrive in the Kingdom of God as we have known it. If not, then we will still be a part of the Kingdom of God but how it looks in our communities may need to change.
