

so what is a Lewis?



A Lewis is an operative tool, Masonic symbol, and the name given to the son of a Freemason. In building parlance, a Lewis is an instrument used by operative masons. It consists of a cramp iron which is inserted into a cavity specifically prepared for that purpose in any large stone, so as to give attachment to a pulley and hook whereby the stone may be easily raised to any height and located in its proper position, in the English Constitution, the Lewis is found on the tracing board of the Entered Apprentice, where it is used as a symbol of strength. The son of an English Freemason is referred to as a Lewis, seemingly because as part of his familial duty he is "to support the sinking powers and aid the failing strength of his father."
