MASTER'S FORUM

Brethren:

Spring is here and the weather is warming up, though it means more rain then snow for us lately. March of course is the Celebration of St. Patrick's day and with it a perchance to wear green and be merry, and the spring equinox. In Masonic History there were many Lodges Chartered under the Irish constitutions. In fact, the first "Travelling Lodge", a lodge associated with a travelling military given regiment was an Irish Constitution in 1732 to the Regiment of Foot (later to become The Royal Scots) when they were stationed in Ireland from 1715-1742. This was 9 years and 23 years prior to Grand Lodge of Scotland or Grand Lodge of **England respectively issuing their first** travelling warrants to Military Lodges. By 1823, there were over 123 military lodges with Travelling Warrants labouring under the Grand Lodge of Ireland. Many of the regiments were English or Scottish origin but were stationed for a time in Ireland and received their Warrant from the Irish Constitutions. Interesting enough many of these Travelling Lodges are also credited with the spread of Freemasonry in North America. There was many Military Lodges in North America, mostly of Irish Constitution, those contributed to predominance of "Ancient" versus "Moderns" working in the Lodges being chartered at this time. difference in workings and philosophy eventually led to 2 Grand Lodges in London, the Ancients, and the Moderns. Moderns were the premier **Grand Lodge but modernized its ritual** much to the dismay of the Irish (and some Scottish) immigrants to London who were instrumental in forming the Ancient Grand Lodge to counter the revision of the ritual. In 1813 there was a comprise and the Ancient and Modern Grand Lodges merged into the United Grand Lodge of England. Lodges in North America can trace their history though this time with {Continued on next Column}

some being Ancient and/or Accepted Freemasons and some being Accepted Freemasons etc.

For us, March will be dedicated to the PM of the Lodge and as such our emergent meeting in March will be a Past Masters' Night where they will confer the Fellowcraft Degree on Bros. Douglas and Welsh given they have made suitable proficiency in the work of the preceding degree. This is an older tradition in Discovery Lodge, and I look forward to it being revived again, and seeing the many PM of Discovery. Also, this month is the installation of Rainbow Lodge and brethren are encouraged to support our neighbouring Lodge.
