The Letter "G"

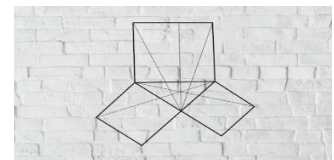

The 47<sup>th</sup> Problem of Euclid is also known as the 47<sup>th</sup> Proposition of Euclid or the Pythagorean Theorem.

The name originated from Euclid, recognized as the father of geometry.

The mathematical representation of the symbol is in the ratio 3:4:5.

In Speculative Freemasonry, the 47<sup>th</sup> Problem of Euclid stands for Masons' importance to 'square their square.'

In other words, members of the craft are required to align their lives in order. Operative Freemasons used the symbol to lay out strong foundations in construction.
